

Dear Friends,

The new year of 2022 is well underway. School holidays have come to an end, kids are back in the classrooms while mum and dads are back to work and life's pace seems to be quickening again. After the excitement of Advent, The Nativity and the Octave of Christmas, in these weeks the Church's calendar also takes on a different pace. By comparison to Christmas, Advent, Easter and the scores of other feast days throughout the year, Ordinary Time does not sound very exciting. In the English language Ordinary often means that something is not special or distinctive. When something is ordinary it can mean that it is than ideal or falling short of the mark.

But Ordinary Time does not mean bland or "common time". The word Ordinary comes from the latin word Ordinalis which talks about a numbers in a series. Its root word is ordo, from which we get the English worder order. So Ordinary time is a season where we are neither feasting nor fasting, but an ordered, sequenced preparation and catechesis as we watch and wait for the coming of Christ.

The Sunday readings for Ordinary Time this year began with the Wedding at Cana where lesus transforms water into wine. Jesus' first miracle sets the scene for the rest of Jesus public ministry- like at the wedding feast God dwells among his people, God's grace changes the ordinary things of our life into extraordinary things; God surprises us and works unexpectantly in life's everyday moments.

This is what we too can look forward to in Ordinary Time. The color green on the vestments and displayed around the Church symbolises hope and growth. As we descend from the great mountain peaks of Easter and Christmas we pasture on in the valleys on green grass of this season. As we consider the life of Christ from every angle – his life, his miracles, teachings, his trials and challenges - we grow in faith and love.

PPLT

St Thomas More Parish has a proud tradition of parishioners being actively involved and engaged in the life of the Church both within our community and beyond. One obvious example of this is the Parish Pastoral Leadership Team – PPLT.

I want to acknowledge the generous contribution of all those who have served the Parish on the PPLT and especially that of our chair, Jacinta Griffin. It has not been easy for the PPLT to operate in and out of lockdowns over the last two and a bit years while also grappling with constantly changing COVID restrictions, a change of clergy (twice!), a diocesan parish restructure as well as the usual parish business.

Thankyou to current and previous PPLT members for your generous contribution of time and talent.

When I arrived at St Thomas More there were already some vacant positions on the PPLT. While I was still becoming familiar with the Parish and our community, I felt it was important not to make any decisions about PPLT membership until I had got to meet people and understand our Parish. The repeated lockdowns and time of Church closure have extended this time further than I had anticipated. Since last January there we have more vacancies as PPLT members have relocated or resigned.

As we begin this new year with much more certainty with COVID restrictions it seems the time is right to consider the membership of PPLT and how St Thomas More can be represented in the future.

I have asked Lorraine McCarthy from the Archdiocesan Proclaim Office to help run a discernment workshop on Saturday, February 26th. Lorraine will help us to think and pray about where we are as a Parish community, where we see ourselves in the future, and how we are going to get there.

The Church's Code of Canon Law gives a helpful summary of how a Pastoral Council is to be chosen (CCC 512/2)

The Christian faithful who are appointed to the pastoral council are to be so selected that the entire portion of the people of God which constitutes the diocese is truly reflected, with due regard for the diverse regions, social conditions and professions of the diocese as well as the role which they have in the apostolate, either as individuals or in conjunction with others.

Anyone is welcome to attend the session which will form a part of the process for appointing new members to PPLT.

Details about timing and place for the meeting on the 26th will be finalised in next weekend's bulletin. If anyone is interested in becoming a PPLT member or to I earn more, I would be happy to speak with you before then.
