

The plenary council concluded last week in Sydney. Last week's meeting is the culmination of several years of dialogue and discernment around Australia. I know many



parishioners at St Thomas More contributed to these discussions about the future of our Church and take a keen interest in events. Last week the plenary discussed and voted on questions around reconciliation, mission, healing and reconciliation, ecology and the place of women in the Church. Next week I will be attending the Divine Renovation Conference with a group of seven from Melbourne -priests as well as laity from the Office for Evangelisation. The conference will be led by Fr James Mallon from Halifax and Ron Huntley who specialises in coaching and development. We will be experiencing weekend Masses and community at St Anne's Parish in Copel, and learning from other leaders about how to bring the good news to our parish communities through discernment of gifts, structures, leadership and proclamation. The following week I will be making my annual retreat with the 8 days of exercises under direction with the Jesuit priests at Manresa.

The last two weeks I will be on holidays and I will be back at Mt Eliza for Masses beginning on Saturday 13th August. I will continue to keep you all in my prayers while away and offer Mass for you all.

Gospel Reading Luke 10:38-42 Jesus visits the house of Martha and Mary.

Background on the Gospel Reading

The story of Jesus in the home of Martha and Mary complements the story of the Good Samaritan, which immediately precedes it in Luke's Gospel. Both stories are unique to Luke. The story of the Samaritan

opens with the words "a certain man." Today's reading opens with the words "a certain woman." The Samaritan is an example of how a disciple should see and act. Mary is an example of how a disciple should listen. Mary, a woman, is a marginalized person in society, like the Samaritan. Both do what is not expected of them.

As a woman, Mary would be expected, like Martha, to prepare hospitality for a guest. Here again lesus breaks with the social conventions of his time. Just as a Samaritan would not be a model for neighbourliness, so a woman would not sit with the men around the feet of a teacher.

Both stories exemplify how a disciple is to fulfill the dual command which begins chapter 10love of God (Mary) and love of neighbour (the Samaritan). These are the two essentials of life the kingdom. in

By using the examples of a Samaritan and a woman, however, lesus is saying something more. Social codes and boundaries were strict in Jesus' time. Yet to love God with all one's heart and one's neighbour requires breaking those rules. The Kingdom of God is a society without distinctions and boundaries between its members. It is a society that requires times for seeing and doing and also times for listening and learning at the feet of a teacher.
