On Saturday the 14th of May we will have celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation with around 40 children at St Thomas More Parish. This includes five candidates being prepared at the Parish who have been prepared by our Cate-



chist and attending Mass following each Tuesday night session. Bishop Anthony Ireland visited the school last week and discussed with them the importance of this Sacrament in their lives as Christians, what it means to be a Catholic, and how the gifts of the Holy Spirit transform into fruits in our lives.

The children were very excited to receive this Sacrament and were reminded that at this point in their life, they are now able to stand up and respond with their own voice to affirm all that we believe in the creed. Confirmation, like Baptism, Marriage and Holy Orders is Sacrament which is given once, but which can continue to bear fruit and give life every day that we are open to God's grace and goodness.

As we discussed with the confirmation candidates, this doesn't happen by itself. The more we use the gifts of the Spirit: wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and fear of the Lord, the more we can fear the good fruit of the spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self control.

We pray that our Candidates will be blessed by their confirmation day, and will use the gifts of the Holy Spirit to transform their lives through God's spirit. As we approach the feast of Pentecost, we are all encouraged to turn again to the Holy Spirit who was given to us in Baptism and Confirmation, so that we would bear good fruit through God's spirit given to us.

As Pope Francis said "Jesus does not work by magic, with special effects, with flashing lights and fireworks. Jesus keeps knocking on our door in the faces of our brothers and sisters, in the faces of our neighbors, in the faces of those at our side".-Fr Patrick
