Dear Friends,

When I was growing up I remember visiting friends houses from school, and noticing how things were done were a little bit differently in their house compared to ours. Mealtimes were different; conversations at the table were about different things. There were different traditions and rituals; in our house you had to go to bed at 9pm, but some of my friends could go to bed whenever they liked.

Every family is different because each member of the contributes their own unique personality and experiences. It often amazes me that siblings from the same family, with the same parents, can sometimes turn out so different from each other. Spending a lot of time living with another family enables us to get to know them in a deeper way, but also helps us to understand our own families too.

As we consider this great feast of the Holy Trinity, we are invited to spend time with God's family, which is at once mysterious and familiar. In our families we can think about people in terms of what they do, but more profoundly, we think about about who they are, and their relationships. So too with God's family. The Father has neither a beginning nor end; he existed before time and will exist after time ceases. The Father is revealed in scripture as the life-giver, authority, powerful protector. He is

immense, omnipotent, omniscient, omnipresent with infinite power and charity that goes beyond human understanding. Thomas Aquinas, after completing his 3000 page Summa Theologica concluded that he had "not yet begun to understand 'God the Father".

In God's family, the Father has a son. Jesus is made of the same substance as the Father as we recite in the Nicean Creed. While the father and son are very close, they are not identical. Their strength comes from their differences. The son loves the father so much that he is obedient (from the latin word—to listen)—Jesus chooses to desire and loves the same things as God the father. Jesus came into our world to reveal his father's love to us and to teach us how to pray. Jesus shows us how to be human by using our freedom in a way that is so in sync with the fathers will, that we are divinised and made holy. One of the reasons why Jesus was executed was because he dared to call God his Father; he crossed chasm between creation and creator.

The powerful love between father and son is not exclusive, but overflows in the form of another person—the Holy Spirit. The Spirit is what animated Jesus throughout his ministry. The spirit is another person who is known to do extraordinary things: the spirit forgive sins; brings unity, imparts life through baptism and the Sacraments; inspires and encourages; reassures and convicts.

In God's family, each person has a different personality which reveals an aspect of the one God. I think many older married couples, having spent many years together can offer us a glimpse into how God's family operates. Man and wife are different, complementary and free, and yet each wants to spend time with their beloved. They don't always need to say much—they already know what the other one is thinking. They can anticipate the other persons needs. They know what to order off the menu for the their spouse. They work as a team, and their differences are their strength. This Sunday we consider the incredible bond of love that unites God's family. May this divine love inspire our own relationships in our own families.


