In the last few days we have been privileged to celebrate three major feast days. The solemnity of St Patrick on the 17th of March bears witness to deep faith of the men and women who were foundational for the Melbourne Church. The waves of Catholics arriving from Ireland made a tremendous



contribution to our Church. Archbishop Mannix who arrived from Maynooth Seminary in 1913 was instrumental in establishing a Church in Melbourne that had strong parishes, a local seminary and was focussed on education and supporting the family.

On the 19th of March we celebrated St Joseph's Feast Day. St Joseph was given the tremendous responsibility, together with Mary, of raising God's son of teaching him the traditions of faith, the building relationships within the extended family, the importance of work and supporting the family. St Joseph's example of humble simplicity is a great encouragement to all of us – especially Dad's whose vocation is to help their young ones grow to maturity. On Monday we celebrated Mass with his statue in pride of place near the front of the Church.

On Saturday, 25th of March we celebrated the Feast of the Annunciation. This feast, nine months before the birth of Jesus, is first of all, a joyful reminder of the sanctity of human life in all its stages of development.

Jesus, co-creator of the universe began his life totally reliant on his creation,

namely his mother Mary. Mary reminds us that God in some mysterious way relies on us to co-operate with him in bringing his kingdom of peace, justice and life to reality in the world. Mary's "yes" of faith would grow within her, ultimately bearing the fruit of new life.

In the midst of the prayer, fasting and generosity that lent inspires, the Church proposes these feasts as part of our journey of consolation and desolation, the ups and downs that lead us ultimately to the mountain of Calvary where Jesus gives his life to us. May each of us continue to make use of this great season to grow in our appreciation of the faith witnessed by the saints – especially Mary, Joseph and St Patrick

Over the last several weeks the Parish has been advertising World Youth Day 2023 in Lisbon, Portugal. World Youth Day is a major bi or tri annual festival which brings together youth from around the world to be formed in their faith, to hear from the wisdom and guidance of Pope Francis, to celebrate the sacraments, to meet other young people from around the world and to build relationships with other young Catholics from Melbourne.

Melbourne will be taking 585 young people aged 16-35 from parishes and schools to participate in this exciting opportunity.
