In these last few weeks of the season of Easter, the readings from the Acts, St Peter's letter and the Gospel of John are preparing us for the Ascension and the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

Jesus made it possible for us to know and love God's family—the
Holy Trinity. Before his crucifixion, Jesus promised his disciples
that while he must go to be with the Father, he would send another advocate, a
helper for us. The Holy Spirit radically transformed the apostles from being fearful,
isolated, downcast to becoming bold, united and optimistic.

As we now begin the second week of our Parish Offertory Renewal campaign, the readings at this Sunday's Mass give us a marvellous glimpse into God's generous character. The Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father and the Son. The Spirit is an expression of the total and complete gift of Jesus to his Father, and the Father's gift of his son to us. The spirit that animated Jesus to restore sight to the blind, to set captives free, to teach the truth and to baptise is the same spirit that we receive in full through our baptism and confirmation. The Holy Spirit, Jesus promises "is with you and is in you". And so, through this promise we are given the same opportunity to participate in the animating power of God's family who is constantly in a state of giving and receiving.

We can never be more generous than God, who gave us everything he has—even his own son. We see in Jesus the same attitude that everything he has received from the father is given for a greater purpose. In the creation account in Genesis God gives us, men and women, a mandate of stewardship to care and look after the beautiful and wonderful gifts that God has given. Men and women are given the freedom to name and to use the plants and animals for his greater glory. This commandment continues today. Each of us has been trusted with gifts which ultimately are not just for us, but for God's kingdom. We have each come from a family, and belong to a family. We live in a beautiful country with stable government and institutions, where we have immense freedom to choose what path we may take in life. We have access to the beauty of nature and beautiful art and music. We have relative peace and freedom to live our Catholic faith, to live according to our conscience. Through the Church and civic life we work to make these opportunities accessible to all in our society, especially the most vulnerable.

This week, may we take a moment to appreciate all the goodness that I have been given—through our faith and friendship with God, through our relationships with family and friends, through our work at home or in society, through rest and recreation. May we foster a sense of gratitude to God for these gifts. God desires for us to be happy. Thomas More found his happiness in using his incredible intellect, his sense of compassion, his commitment to truth and justice for others. Jesus used his divine powers to establish the kingdom of God. May we grow in experiencing the power of gratitude which is revealed to us in the Holy Spirit and through Father and Son. May this spirit guide us to use God's gifts wisely and well.



#### Archbishop Peter A Comensoli's visit to St Thomas More on June 10th

Recently Archbishop Comensoli has confirmed that he will be visiting Mount Eliza on June 10th to install me as the fourth Parish Priest of St Thomas More Parish. This celebration will take place during the Saturday evening Vigil Mass at 5pm and all parishioners are invited to join us. There will be a reception to follow afterwards, with more details to follow including RSVP instructions.


While the appointment as PP took effect last April, the installation ceremony is an important moment for the life of our Parish, and for me. This visit is a practical and tangible sign of the Archbishop's care and concern for our community. The appointment and ceremony brings with it certainty that we can confidently work together to plan and build the Parish, it represents the stability necessary for the pastor to put down roots, to get to know people, to build relationships (to make mistakes!) and to learn from them. It gives us all an opportunity to plan for the future and respond to the challenges and opportunities of life post COVID. It allows to move forward after a time of change and uncertainty. A small committee will be put together to organise the evening with info to follow.

Later in June on Thursday the 22nd we will celebrate the feast of St Thomas More. Thomas More was chosen as our Parish patron because like most of the Mount Eliza community, his first vocation was as a parent with responsibilities for his wife and family; for his work and his contribution to society. More also had deep interest in education, and a commitment to justice, to following a well formed conscience and serving God and the King. This year we hope to come together and celebrate More feast day on Sunday, 25th of June. Details will follow in next week's Seasons.

#### **World Youth Day 2023**

World Youth Day is a major bi or tri annual festival which brings together youth from around the world to be formed in their faith, to hear from the wisdom and guidance of Pope Francis, to celebrate the sacraments, to meet other young people from around the world and to build relationships with other young Catholics from Melbourne. Our Archdiocese will be taking 585 young people aged 16-35 from parishes and schools to participate in this exciting opportunity.

St Thomas More Parish is pleased that two pilgrims from our Parish will be attending – Matthew and Charles Sayah. I have separately been invited by Archbishop Peter to attend as one of the supporting chaplains to the Melbourne group.



The pilgrimage will leave Melbourne on 29th of July and we will travel to Fatima, where we will spend four days visiting the Shrine of Our Lady, celebrating the Eucharist and being immersed in the faith of Jacinta, Lucia and Francisco. Then our group will join the other 500 pilgrims from Melbourne and several million from around the world for the week in Lisbon. Shortly after our return to Melbourne in September there will be a retreat with the Archbishop ordered towards sending out and equipping pilgrims to live their faith in parish communities. The organisers have ensured our Parish Pilgrims will be journeying together with other young people from neighbouring parishes in Hastings, Mornington, Rosebud and Padua College, and that these relationships will continue to build in time.

The cost for the flights, accommodation and meals for the 14 day trip for each pilgrim is \$5,900. Matthew and Charles are working to raise 1/3; the Parish has agreed to support them with a further 1/3 and it is my sincere hope that we are able to raise the final 1/3 by hosting events and engagement within our community. The fundraising target then for both pilgrims comes to \$4000. At this stage an event(s) are being planned through the PPLT to happen late June or July. We look forward to Matthew and Charles speaking to the congregation in the coming weeks and allowing us all to be involved in this important faith journey.
