I am very grateful for the great impact of the Parish Mission which was hosted by St Thomas More Parish over the last week or so.

John Pridmore's story begins with his experience of growing up and not having an awareness of God's love, and moved to the encounter and change he had by meeting Jesus when he was at his lowest and most vulnerable.

John's visit began last Friday with a talk to around 400 year 11 students from Padua College. John described his life as a 16 year old and beyond – 'having everything the world says makes you happy, but having a deep emptiness inside'. John led the students in a prayer and encouraged them to turn to Jesus for solace and strength in their times of struggle.

Later that morning, John spoke to around 70 students from St Thomas More Primary School. Here the focus changed to speaking about God's love for each one of us and how working with Mother Teresa taught John how to love. The children were reminded about how unique and special they are, and that God has a perfect plan for their lives. Later on Friday evening, we visiting Quinn's Place — an initiative of St McCartan's Parish. Here around 50 young people aged 12-20 listened to John's story of conversion, and how despair and hopelessness was transformed into freedom and purpose.

On Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday this week John presented his three main talks to our community. "God's Love" focussed on the personal impact of knowing and experiencing the love of God and how this experience gives us the confidence and strength to trust in God.

The second night, "God's healing" focussed on opening our hearts to God through the Sacraments.

On the final night the congregation was invited to receive an individual blessing with the Eucharist. This was a powerful experience that left a deep impression on me, and many in our community.

While the Parish Mission went for three days it is clear that the impact of these encounters will continue in the hearts and minds of our parishioners long into the future.

I would like to sincerely thank the team of parishioners who met for several weeks planning and organising the mission, and for all those who volunteered with setting up the church, helping on the nights and offering hospitality afterwards. It was great to see the Parish Community Centre filled with so much energy and life each night.
