Dear Friends,

This weekend we celebrate the feast of Corpus Christ—the body and blood of Christ. The Catholic (and Orthodox) teaching on the Eucharist sets our churches apart from every other denomination. The treasure of the Eucharist has been handed down to us over many centuries through the faith and belief of Christians—many of whom gave their lives as a witness to their belief in the real presence of Jesus Christ on the altar. While some Anglicans and other Christians believe that the Eucharist is a powerful symbol, or a representation of Jesus, or that the Eucharist depends on the faith of the person receiving it, Catholics have a more radical belief which can be traced back to St John's gospel. When teaching on the Eucharist, St John tells us, the large crowds were appalled at Jesus teaching on the Eucharist as being a physical eating of his body and blood. Jesus was invited to rephrase or soften his message to make it more digestible. Instead, Jesus goes even further, saying "amen, I tell you, unless you eat my body and drink my blood you have no life in you". It is clear that this teaching on the real presence of the Eucharist meant that huge numbers stopped following Jesus. As St John's gospel reports, Jesus turns to his own disciples and asks them will you leave me too? Sadly many Catholics today do not hold a belief in the real presence of Jesus, survey results in Australia vary somewhere between 5% and 40% of Catholics holding this belief. Yet, the Eucharist is a powerful aid and strength for our faith. When we are well prepared and understand this mystery, the spiritual food of Jesus's body and blood gives us strength and power to live our faith. The Eucharist allows Jesus to literally become a part of us, and for us to become a part of God. "Communion", or "Holy Communion" emphasises the bond that we have as members of God's family that links us together. When someone approaches to receive Holy Communion, the statement is made by the priest or extraordinary minister "The Body of Christ" -which means—this is the body of Christ. The communicant responds—Amen. Amen means, yes, I believe, I

Support for Sound System. Back in 2018 (only six years ago) the Parish spent \$43,844 on new microphones, speakers, and AV equipment. Unfortunately despite this significant investment, Our wireless lapel microphones are not working properly. This will impact on sound until a solution can be found. Our sound technician has now advised that we should invest in one high quality replacement mic for \$2,100 which should last 10+ years. Six donors have contributed \$870 towards this purchase. The new equipment should be installed once the order arrives in July. Our sincere to those who have offered generous support for this project. —Fr Patrick

Words are important, as words signify reality. This is why the Church asks those who are not in communion to come forward for a blessing. Corpus Christi also a good time to remind ourselves of how to receive Holy Communion. Whether we receive on the hand or on the tongue, we should prepare ourselves well as we approach the minister. If we receive on the hand, one hand should go over the other to make a "throne" for the Lord to be placed in our hands. We do not take Holy Communion, the Church gives this to us as a gift. It is practical to stand aside, pause for a moment or two before making our way back to our seat for quiet prayer, reflection and thanksgiving.



St Thomas More Feast Day Celebrations

June 22nd is the official feast day of our patron saint, Thomas More. Due to calendar issues the Parish will be celebrating St Thomas More's patronage of our Parish on Sunday 2nd of June.

The first event was on Friday, 31st of May. A social night with drinks and nibbles was followed by a screening of the newly released film Cabrini. For those who haven't yet seen it, the film depicts the life of Mother Francis Xavier Cabrini, who worked tirelessly to support the poor and destitute beginning in New York but is now worldwide. St Cabrini and St Thomas More share a passion for justice, the dignity of every human person, the primacy of education and religious freedom. The film has a 90% rating and has been very popular worldwide. Thankyou to all those who helped to host this event and for the 25 or so parishioners who attended.

On Sunday 2nd of June during the 10am Mass we will consider St Thomas More in the light of the feast of Corpus Christi. To bring our whole community together for this celebration there will be no 8am Mass on Sunday, 2nd of June. Following the Mass there will be a festive medieval luncheon with drinks and multiple courses and live music from the 1500's performed on a recorder and viola-de-gamba.

St Thomas More was chosen as Patron Saint of our parish because he was someone that we could relate to. Mount Eliza is a community with a significant number of families with working mums and dads. Like St Thomas More people in our community have a passion for justice, for education, for pro-family values. St Thomas More lived 500 years ago, but he still very much a Saint for our times, and for our community.
