Dear Friends,

Every week we recite the creed at Mass, a prayer which contains some powerful truths about our faith. We often use the Apostles



creed, which is an earlier, succinct statement of belief that came out of the early church, beginning the year 180 AD. Over time the Church began to reflect more and more on what Jesus revealed to us and formulated the Nicean Creed in the year 325 at the Council of Nicea. As we celebrate this weekend Trinity Sunday, the feast which recognises God as three persons, we reflect on the deeply profound truth that God one being with three persons. Below is a commentary which talks about the creed and the trinity from the UK Bishop's Conference:

Can you remember when you first heard the Creed? Chances are you don't. It is used at baptism which, for many, takes place when we are small. At every baptism either the parents and godparents or the persons being baptised profess their faith. There are two Creeds used regularly; the Apostles' Creed and the Nicene. The Apostles' Creed was first used at baptisms in ancient Rome. The Nicene Creed was drawn largely from the work of the Councils of Nicea and Constantinople which affirmed that Jesus is both God and a human being. Originally it too was used with those who were to be baptised. Because of this it began with I believe. We believe, I believe The Nicene Creed was introduced at Mass in the Eastern Church and the 'I' was altered to 'We' for congregations to recite. We started reciting it at Mass in Rome and the west of Europe much later. We have always used the version written for baptism and in Latin it begins 'credo' - 'I believe'. The creed is said towards the end of the


Alpha Program

Liturgy of the Word as we remember and respond to the call and message of God. Beginning with 'we believe' helps us say that we share our faith with others. On the other hand, using 'I believe' reminds me of the promises made at baptism. As I pray the creed I remember that I am a member of the family of the Church. We emphasise this at Easter when we renew our baptismal promises by using the question and answer form based on the Apostles' Creed. We think about Baptism a great deal in the seasons of Lent and Easter and so we can use the Apostles' Creed at Mass during these times. Consubstantial with the Father The Nicene Creed helps focus on who God the Son is and on his Incarnation. We speak of him as God from God, Light from Light etc. We use the word 'consubstantial' to say that Jesus has the same nature as God and that he is God himself. Our faith in the Trinity means we believe in three persons who are not three Gods but one God. In Jesus, God took our human nature so that the person who is the eternal Son of God was born in time and is the person who is the Son of Mary. We bow as a sign of respect (at Christmas, we genuflect) at the words, 'and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man'. The Creed is a sign we are

St Thomas More Feast Day Celebrations

June 22nd is the official feast day of our patron saint, Thomas More. Due to calendar issues the Parish will be celebrating St Thomas More's patronage of our Parish from May 31st to Sunday 2nd of June.

The first event will be on Friday, 31st of May in a social night with drinks and nibbles followed by a screening of the newly released film Cabrini. For those who haven't yet seen it, the film depicts the life of Mother Francis Xavier Cabrini, who worked tirelessly to support the poor and destitute beginning in New York but is now worldwide. St Cabrini and St Thomas More share a passion for justice, the dignity of every human person, the primacy of education and religious freedom. The film has a 90% rating and has been very popular worldwide.

On Sunday 2nd of June the 10am Mass will consider St Thomas More in the light of the feast of Corpus Christi. To bring our whole community together for this celebration there will be no 8am Mass on that Sunday. Following the Mass there will be a festive medieval luncheon with drinks and multiple courses and live music from the 1500's performed on a recorder and viola-de-gamba. Cost is \$30 for adults or \$15 for under 18's for lunch and drinks,. St Thomas More is saint for our own times, and we have much to learn and be inspired by his vision. I warmly invite you to participate in these events.
