Dear friends,

On November 1st and 2nd the Church begins the month of November with an invitation to remember the "last things"- death, judgement, heaven and hell. November is a time when we particularly remember our beloved family and friends who have gone before us, especially those whom we have lost within the last twelve months.

On 1st of November we triumphantly celebrated the feast of All Saints – all the saints who are united in love in God's kingdom, seeing God face to face, fully alive and free in his kingdom. The saints in heaven are praying for each one of us, and their example of courage, strength and faith is a reminder that God is faithful to his promises, and extravegent in his generosity, sharing his own inner life with us in heaven. The next day, November 2nd, we pray for the Holy Souls. The doctrine of purgatory finds its origins throughout scripture – particularly in the book of Maccabees, where Judas Maccabeus takes up an offering so that sacrifice can be offered for those who at their death wanted to be with God, but are not perfect enough to enter the fullness of God's light and love. Purgatory is not meant to be understood as a punishment but as gift or grace. The "front porch of heaven" is one image of explaining how those destined to be saints are gently exposed to more and more of God's love and grace; God's light purifies and sanctifies them so that they can enter the new Jerusalem. When a loved one is separated from us because of sickness, work or travel we experience a kind of pain at not being able to get close and spend time with them. The longer we spend away from them, the more we miss them and long for them to come home. This is the kind of "pain" that the Holy Souls feel - the deep longing to be with God, but the sadness that they are not yet ready to embrace.

During the month of November we are invited to support our beloved dead firstly by praying for them - perhaps at mealtimes with the traditional prayer "may the souls of the faithful departed through the mercy of God rest in peace". We can also offer our rosary or other devotions for this intention. November offords an opportunity to visit the graves of our loved ones and spend some time thanking God for their lives and praying that we will be reunited with them one day. Because we believe in the physical resurrection of the body, we know that the body buried in the earth will be the same body restored and resurrected at the end of time. Parents may find this month a good prompt to appropriately and gently introduce to their children the mystery of death, which for Catholics need not be scary, but is an open doorway that we must all walk through and meet Jesus face to face when our time comes. The feast of Christ the King at the end of November marks the end of our church's year, and also the end of time and the end of this world. One day Christ's kingdom will be complete
