Reflection on today's Second Reading:

Wherever you find jealousy and ambition, you find disharmony, and wicked things of every kind being done.' (James 3:16) Everyone has ambitions. Sometimes a young person might say, 'My ambition when I grow up is to be a doctor' (or a teacher, or an Olympic gold medallist). And some of us have higher ambitions than others. Some people have the ambition to be prime minister. We all have desires for fulfilment. For example, we find fulfilment in making good use of our talents in the service of other people. That is how human beings are; that is how God made us. But St James in our second reading today speaks about a negative kind of ambition: 'Wherever you find jealousy and ambition, you find disharmony, and wicked things of every kind being done.' So one kind of negative ambition is jealous ambition: we want, not just to do well — we have to be the best, and maybe even to the extent that we find ourselves hoping that other people do badly.

In the gospel today we hear of the same kind of ambition: the disciples are arguing on the road about which of them is the greatest. And Jesus says to them, 'If anyone wants to be first, he must make himself last of all and servant of all.' In itself, there is nothing wrong with having the ambition to be a leader. We need good leaders, and some people are born with the talent for that. But it is an ambition which needs to be treated with special caution: so often it can turn into the desire just to be 'number one', to be on top and have power over other people.

We have probably all experienced in ourselves that determination to get our own way no matter what. And of course, when two people want their own way no matter what, a fight is going to happen. So the problem is not with having desires, having ambitions. The problem comes when we make our own ambitions absolute – when we focus on them so much that we do not put them into the bigger context of what is good for other people – ultimately, when we do not put them into the bigger context of God's commandments, and especially the greatest commandment, the commandment of love.

Ambition in a negative sense comes about because we do not have harmony within ourselves, the harmony that comes from being subject to God. St James asks us, 'Where do these wars and battles between yourselves first start? Isn't it precisely in the desires fighting inside your own selves?' It is only when we make God's will the absolute law of our lives that everything else falls into place. God's plan is for the good of each person, and for the good of all of us together as a community, so it is by following his will that we find harmony.

First of all, things fall into place in our own hearts, instead of all our desires battling each other; and second, things fall into place in our relationships with other people. When the first priority in our hearts is the will of God, then we do not make our own desires and preferences absolute. We are willing to give way to other people when that is the appropriate thing to do. This is what gives us peace, and ultimately it is

There will be a Requiem Mass for Margaret McCartney at St Thomas More on Tuesday 24th September at 10:30am the only way peace can come to the whole world. But only by following that path of self-denial do we come to resurrection, to the true fulfilment that comes when we have peace with God, peace within our own hearts, and peace with one another. –
