40 years ago this weekend

In January 1979, Archbishop Frank Little wrote two letters to Fr Hilton Deakin. The first included the words, "Because of the spiritual needs of the people of that part of the Mornington Parish known as Mount Eliza...I hereby erect the new Parish of Mount Eliza. And in the second, "I appoint you as Pastor of the new Parish of Mount Eliza...You will please proceed to your new Parish at midday on Saturday 27th January 1979. I know that the people of your new Parish will welcome you and will receive from you the pastoral care they so richly deserve."

In accordance with his instructions, Fr Deakin moved to Mount Eliza on 27th January 1979. The proposed presbytery 'The Ranch' was bare of furnishing with the exception of a chair in one room. In the absence of a bed, he spent his first night on a borrowed mattress laid on the floor, and was bitten on one of his arms by a venomous spider. This resulted in pain, swelling of the arm and stiffening of the elbow; nevertheless next day Fr Deakin celebrated

the first Parish Mass in Morning Star. In his homily he declared his aims to be "to help create a Eucharistic Community and to preach the Gospel".

For the first 3 months in the life of the new parish all weekend services were celebrated by Fr Deakin in the chapel of Morning Star. Then he was tersely told by the Archdiocesan Chancellor that he would have to vacate Morning Star as it was being sold. Despite his protestations the move of all the furniture and fittings was perforce carried out, over one weekend by the parishioners, down the hill to the chapel at Greyfriars. Situated in a lovely rural setting, the small chapel overlooking Sunnyside Beach on Port Phillip Bay was to be the spiritual home of St Thomas More parish for nearly four years.

New Year Hamper Raffle


Thanks, too, to everyone who contributed and then bought tickets in this Raffle. Congratulations to Mary Cameron who won it! Another \$488 was raised from this.

St Thomas More's School Community Pathway

Baptisms

These are held on the 1st & 3rd Sundays of each month at 11:15 am or at any of the Parish Masses on the 2nd, 4th or 5th Sundays. A compulsory preparation night for parents takes place on the first Tuesday of each month in the Parish Community Centre at 7:30 pm. The next Baptism Preparation Evening will be held on the 5th February 2019. Children to be baptised, and their families, are then invited to a Welcome Mass prior to Baptism where they are

introduced to the Parish Community and welcomed by them. In order for this to happen, preparation needs to begin at least <u>4-6 weeks</u> before the Baptism, with a call to confirm parents' attendance at the Preparation Night. When children of school age are to be baptised an extended preparation time is required.

It is important to remember that Baptism is about the initiation of a child into a community of Faith or a community of Disciples. There is no such thing as a 'private' Baptism... it is something done by the whole Church.
