

Church Teaching on Social Justice

Whenever Jesus encountered a person suffering from a physical or mental impediment holding them apart from the community, he restored their dignity and drew them into the light. He proclaimed the 'reign of God', which is a reign of justice.

Whenever we assist another, especially someone whose dignity has been downtrodden, we are a source of light to them. No matter how small our action may be, we become co-workers in proclaiming the reign of justice.

Catholic Social Teaching sums up the teachings of the Church on social justice issues. It promotes a vision of a just society that is grounded in the Bible and in the wisdom gathered from experience by the Christian community as it has responded to social justice through history.

"The Spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me: he has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed, to bind up the broken hearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and release to the prisoners; to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour," Isaiah 61:1-2

Who are the poor, the captives, the blind and the oppressed in society? They are those who lack human dignity, who are set apart from 'acceptable' society for one reason or another.

The social teachings of the Church are designed to protect and promote human dignity as this is the starting point and central concern of Catholic thinking about human rights. Each person is created in the image and likeness of God and so has an inalienable, transcendent God-given dignity. Each member of the human family is equal in dignity and has equal rights because we are all children of the one God.

Every person is worthy of respect simply by virtue of being a human person. People do not lose the right to being treated with respect because of disability, poverty, age, lack of success or race, let alone gain the right to be treated with greater respect because of what they own or accomplish.

The concept of the Common Good refers to the greatest good for all just because they are human beings. We are connected with other people. Each individual, and group, has the right to achieve their potential. Each social group must take account of the rights and aspirations of other groups, and of the well-being of the entire human family.

Our St Thomas More Parish Social Justice Group has decided to focus on several areas in which human beings are not being treated with the dignity and respect owed to them. These are Asylum Seekers and Refugees (BASP); people who have been subjected to human trafficking and slavery (ACRATH); Homelessness (SHAC); Poverty linked to inadequate support to the unemployed (New Start); Poverty (Vinnies) and Youth Justice in Victoria and the Brosnan Centre. However, there are many other ways we as Christians can support others, such as people in care and in need of disability support.

Remember, any small act can benefit another human being.

Assistance Required

Due to building density and social distancing regulations, STM Church can only have a total of 130 attendees for each service (this figure could be doubled when the building density and social distancing rules are further eased by Christmas).

However, before STM Parish can start having 130 attendees at each Mass it is necessary that we have at least a team of 2 volunteers to assist with sanitising the Church after Mass. Also, we need 1 volunteer to supervise the registration process for each Mass. Ideally, we would need to have more than 1 team of volunteers to help with cleaning the Church and to supervise the registration process. NOTE!!!!!

We are trialling a QR (Quick Response) code that has been authorised by the Catholic Archdiocese. This is an alternative way to sign in as you come to Church—it is still preferable that you book your seat ahead of time with the Parish Office.

- 1. Hold the camera up to the code, so that it's all visible, and then a message will drop down from the top of the screen, asking if you want to **Open "asta-staysafe.com.au" in Safari**, or a similar banner will appear on an Android phone
- 2. Tap on the message/banner to open the St Thomas More Parish check in page in your browser. You only need to enter your first name and phone number, and submit.
- 3. If you're checking in for other members of your household who can be contacted on the same number, you can add all names in one hit, separated by commas.
- 4. If you're checking in on behalf of someone else who doesn't have a mobile, you can add their landline number in the contact number field.
