New Stages of re-opening Churches for public Mass and other liturgical services

Dear parishioners,

With the initial easing of some lockdown restrictions for Victorians, Churches are now permitted to open for Masses and liturgies (under strict number and hygiene limitations). Each Church service can have **up to 10 people** – not including the clergy and the people who are required to run the service – i.e. Lectors and AV Operators.

I would like to advise you of the following arrangements for Masses at STM Parish:

Weekday Masses (Resuming Wed 20 May 2020)

Wednesday: 9:15 AM and Friday: 9:15 AM Please Note: 10 people is the maximum limit.

Weekend Masses (Saturday 30 May - Sunday 31 May)

Saturday 30th May @ 4:00 PM – Vigil Mass

@ 6:00 PM – Vigil Mass

Mass arrangements for June—TBA

Sunday 31st May @ 8:00 AM

@ 10:00 AM

@ 5:00 PM

The new Mass arrangements will be reviewed after 31 May 2020 when the Premier gives further guidelines. The Sat 4:00PM Vigil and Sunday 5:00PM Masses are added to make it easier for more parishioners to attend Sunday Mass – if this is what they want to do. The Sat 4:00 PM Vigil may not continue beyond May and Sunday 5:00 PM Mass will cease when Churches return to 'normal' services.

Parishioners who wish to attend any of the Weekday or Weekend Masses <u>MUST</u> make a booking with the STM Parish Office. Upon arriving at the Church, parishioners <u>MUST</u> sign - in the Mass Attendance Register. These are the essential requirements that the Government has asked all Churches and Parishioners to comply with if we want to re-open our churches. People who do not make a booking with the Parish Office **may not be permitted to participate in the Mass.**

I understand that these are very strict rules – but, we must observe them in order to re-open our church for service. I do ask for your pardon and understanding during this difficult time that the diocese and parishes are living in.

From Tuesday 19 May 2020 the Parish will start taking booking for weekday and weekend Masses. Booking for weekend Masses close on Friday@ 5:00PM. Vicki and I will do our best to make sure that all the people who wish to attend Mass will have a fair opportunity to do so.

Finally, I would like to make it clear that all Catholics living in Victoria are still being suspended from

the Sunday Obligation until further notice. Therefore, I do sincerely encourage that the people who are in the vulnerable groups (i.e. over 60 or with other underlining health issues) to consider attending Mass/Prayer online or Mass which is broadcast on the 10 Network. You are the best person to make the decision as to whether or not you should be coming to Church during this time of Covid 19 Pandemic.

Homily

On this Sunday we celebrate the ascension of Jesus. It is a day of joy and hope for the Church. Jesus also wants us to have a share in his victory over sin and death. However, we must remember that Jesus is with us always.

The celebration of the Ascension marks Jesus' physical separation from our human history. However, Jesus says "I am with you always" (MT 28:20). The ascension of Jesus frees him from all restrictions of time and space. Jesus now can be constantly everywhere on earth at any given moment — Jesus is *omnipresent*. Jesus can be present in the sacraments, in the Sacred Scripture, with the patients in hospital, and among the community of faith that gathers in his name all at the same time. Jesus ascended to heaven not to abandon us or to distant himself from us, but this is so he can be more available to all people throughout the world.

As you heard me said it on previous occasions the real challenge for us is to recognise the presence of Jesus within us and around us. Our heart is a special dwelling place for Jesus. Jesus abides in any heart that welcomes him. We need to have some openness in order to recognise the presence of Jesus among us. We need to cast aside all prejudices and 'narrow' expectations and be prepared as Jesus might be coming to us in the most strange and unexpected ways. Sometimes we can put in enormous efforts to look for Jesus when in fact he is present with us in the family member that we do not like, or a colleague that we do not get along with, or the homeless person who we walk pass on the street. We do not need to break an arm and a leg in order to find Jesus.

Before Jesus ascended to heaven he gave the apostles (and through them to the Church) three special commands" 1) to make disciples of all nations; 2) to baptise the new members in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit; 3) to teach the new members to observe all the commands I gave you. Jesus allows the Church to have a share in his universal mission for the world. In the name of Jesus the Church is to gather together the scattered people of God, to initiate new members into the family of Jesus and to teach them everything that we have learnt from Jesus.

There is a trend in the modern Church to adopt new ways to fulfil the mission which Jesus entrusted to the Church. This is encouraged by the Second Vatican Council. Pope John XXIII when he opened the Second Vatican Council said it was time to "open the windows and let in the fresh air." We should take the word of Pope John XXIII seriously. However, we must have our eyes fixed on Jesus whenever we want to adopt new approaches because ultimately it is the mission of Jesus that we are sharing in. We must always, think, feel and speak with the mind and heart of Jesus.

Dear friends, Jesus has honoured us by entrusting us with the task of carrying on his mission. May we always remain faith to Jesus and know that he is with us until the end of time.
