# What's Happening Here ...

## Asylum Seekers and Refugees in Australia's Care

We currently have a significant number of refugees and asylum seekers in our care both within continental Australia and on Nauru, Christmas Island and Papua New Guinea. It has always been legal to seek asylum in Australia and we have human and legal responsibilities for refugees and asylum seekers in our care. The Brigidine Asylum Seekers Project (BASP) is one important Catholic group that assists in practical ways, those within our own local communities, who need a chance to live a decent life, free from fear of death, persecution and torture. Refugees and asylum seekers need the chance to make a new home, where they are safe and can live in some dignity and hope. Here is one practical way to help people in Community Detention in Australia. Hand write a letter to a politician. All the details, from BASP are provided in two documents below: the first document explains how to write a letter and why it is important for us to act; the second provides all the necessary contact details of politicians who make important decisions affecting refugees and asylum seekers.

**Assistance Required**

Soon, the government will permit places of worship to have up to 100 attendees for indoor religious services. Covid – Safe guidelines must be implemented.

Due to building density and social distancing regulations, STM Church can only have between 40 -50 attendees for each service (this figure will be doubled when the building density and social distancing rules are further eased by Christmas). However, before STM Parish can start having 40 attendees at each Mass it is necessary that we have at least a team of 2 volunteers to assist with sanitising the Church after Mass. Also, we need 1 volunteer to supervise the registration process for each Mass. Ideally, we would need to have more than 1 team of volunteers to help with cleaning the Church and to supervise the registration process. ## HOMILY

This weekend we celebrate the feast of Christ the King. Jesus is not a King like any other kings. Jesus did not win people over by violence, nor did he try to dominate his subjects. Jesus came to care, love and serve his people like the shepherds care for their sheep. When reflecting upon the Kingship of Jesus we are invited to think carefully about the way how we have exercised authority/power over the people who are in our care.

During the short years of his public ministry Jesus often spoke about the Kingdom. Jesus' contemporaries thought that he wanted to establish another political kingdom and power. The Roman authority considered Jesus as a threat and wanted to get rid of him. Yet, little did people understand that the Kingdom that Jesus talked about is not like any other earthly kingdoms... This is because Jesus' Kingdom is:

“An eternal and universal Kingdom,  
A kingdom of truth and life,  
A kingdom of holiness and grace.”

No earthly kingdoms or powers can be compared with the Kingdom of Jesus. Each and every one of us is being invited to be citizen of the Eternal King of Jesus.

Jesus our King shows us the right and proper use of authority. In the New Testament we read that Jesus always places himself at the service of others. Jesus teaches those who are ignorant, heals the sick and suffering, restores dignity to those who are marginalised, gives counsels to the sinners, goes out in search of the lost ones, comes to the aid of the helpless, etc. Jesus never uses fear or intimidation to draw people to himself. People choose to gather around Jesus because they recognise in him the love, care and kindness which they are longing for. In Jesus' life and ministry we can see that the right and proper use of authority is for the service and care of others – not to dominate or to oppress.

Many of us are in positions of leadership and authority. The feast of Christ the King invites us to imitate Jesus in his proper exercise of power and authority. The right and proper use of authority always encourages and empowers others – not wanting to take control. The right and proper use of authority always have the goods of others in mind – not to use them to satisfy our own ego. It does take courage for us to learn to be servant leaders.

On this weekend as we celebrate the feast of Christ the King let us pray for all world and Church leaders that they may continue to lead and guide their subjects with the care and tenderness of Christ. May all leaders make good use of their authority and power to bring peace and justice to all.

## Community Corner

### VINNIES SUMMER APPEAL 2020

EARLY THIS YEAR COVID 19 BROUGHT A DRAMATIC CHANGE TO OUR LIVES. VINNIES VISITATION PROCESS CHANGED FROM IN-HOUSE CALLS TO A PHONE CONSULTATION IN WHICH WE ESTABLISHED OUR CLIENTS NEEDS. HAVING ESTABLISHED THE NEED, WE MOSTLY SUPPLIED ASSISTANCE BY WAY OF VOUCHERS, WHEREBY CLIENTS COULD VISIT THE NOMINATED SUPERMARKET FOR THEIR FOOD. BECAUSE OF SOCIAL DISTANCING OUR VISITATIONS WERE LIMITED TO SIX MARRIED COUPLES TRAVELLING IN PAIRS IN THEIR OWN VEHICLE. DURING THAT TIME EIGHT OF THE TWELVE HAVE BEEN INVOLVED WITH MEDICAL ISSUES, RANGING FROM A HOSPITAL STAY FROM BETWEEN THREE WEEKS TO ONE DAY SURGERIES. WE THEREFORE ALWAYS NEED AN INTAKE OF YOUNGER MEMBERS OF VARYING AGES TO FOLLOW IN OUR FOOTSTEPS. THIS YEAR THE YOUNGER MEMBERS HAVE BEEN VERY BUSY WITH THEIR WORK, HOME SCHOOLING AND HOME DUTIES AND FRUSTRATED WITH NOT BEING INVOLVED WITH VISITATIONS. THEY LOOK FORWARD TO GAINING EXPERIENCE WHEN NORMALITY RETURNS. OUR CONFERENCE IS MADE UP OF APPROXIMATELY 25% YOUNG ADULTS THROUGH TO PEOPLE IN THEIR MID EIGHTIES. THERE IS ALWAYS A NEED FOR YOUNGER MEMBERS TO ASSIST ON WEEKENDS AND SCHOOL HOLIDAYS. THIS WOULD TAKE UP ABOUT TWO HOURS OF YOUR TIME. THIS YEAR WE HAVE COPEd BECAUSE NO ONE HAS BEEN ABLE TO HOLIDAY DURING WINTER. NORMALLY WE WOULD PROVIDE FOOD AND TOY HAMPERS FOR CHRISTMAS, BUT BECAUSE OF THE VIRUS WE TOOK AN EARLY DECISION TO GIVE MONEY VOUCHERS IN PLACE OF FOOD AND TOYS. THE VOUCHERS HAVE STRICT LIMITATIONS AS TO WHERE AND FOR WHAT THEY CAN BE EXCHANGED. DUE TO ENFORCED LOW NUMBERS THAT WILL BE ALLOWED TO ATTEND CHURCH, AND THE RESTRICTIONS PLACED ON SCHOOL-CHILDREN PICK-UP, YOU WILL BE INFORMED IN "SEASONS" AS TO HOW YOU CAN DONATE THIS YEAR TOWARDS OUR FOOD AND HAMPER CHRISTMAS GIVING. THERE ARE MANY NEEDY FAMILIES WHO WILL NEED ASSISTANCE THIS CHRISTMAS. REMEMBER - THE POOR WILL ALWAYS BE WITH US.

## **Catholic Schools Governance Update - Media Release 22nd October 2020**

### ***New era for Catholic education in Melbourne with the establishment of Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools Ltd***

Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools Ltd (MACS) has been established to assume the governance and operation of Catholic schools in the Archdiocese of Melbourne, Archbishop Peter A Comensoli says.

The change in governance arrangements will see all 293 schools owned by the Archdiocese, its parishes or associations of parishes in the Archdiocese of Melbourne transferred to MACS, which will be responsible for the governance and operation of the schools.

‘Building on the significant legacy of parish priest led and governed schools, MACS will usher in a new era for Catholic education in the Archdiocese’, Archbishop Peter said.

‘Education is integral to the mission of the Catholic Church to proclaim the Good News, and Catholic schooling forms our young people so they may be equipped with the knowledge, skills and hope to live meaningful lives and enrich the world around them.

‘The establishment of MACS is a necessary and constructive change to the operations for schools that not only reflects community expectations about the operations of schools, but keeps our Christ Centered mission at the heart of all we do in Catholic education.’

A Steering Committee was established in November 2019 to consider changes in governance for Melbourne Catholic schools. The Steering Committee has overseen 11 months of significant consultation and deliberation which has culminated in today’s announcement, Archbishop Peter said.

Archbishop Peter has appointed Mr Gerard Dalbosco as the inaugural Chair of MACS to lead this historic new path for Catholic education in Melbourne. Formerly a senior partner at EY, Mr Dalbosco has had a distinguished career holding several significant leadership roles with EY across Oceania and the Asia-Pacific region. He also has significant governance experience, with current roles including positions with the Committee for Melbourne, Loreto Mandeville Hall Toorak and Newman College.

‘Gerard brings a wealth of strategic vision and governance experience to our efforts’, Archbishop Peter said. ‘I am very pleased to appoint him to this position and excited for what the future holds under his leadership.’

Mr Dalbosco said that he was honoured to be appointed as the inaugural Chair of MACS.

‘Catholic schooling in Melbourne has a profound footprint across our community’, Mr Dalbosco said. ‘We are the largest diocese in Australia and, together with Catholic religious institute schools, provide Catholic education for more than 153,000 students across 335 schools in Victoria, employing over 20,000 teachers and support staff.

‘I look forward to working with Archbishop Peter and key leaders in the Archdiocese to appoint fellow board members as we move the mission of Catholic education in Melbourne forward.’

Mr Dalbosco also said that he was looking forward to helping foster the renewed relationship between parishes and schools.

‘Parishes are the core of Church life in Melbourne’, he said. ‘These communities have not only planned for but, in many cases, built and paid for schools out of their own pockets because of their understanding of the need for Catholic education in the Archdiocese.

‘I am looking forward to MACS working closely with parish priests and parishes, which will continue to be central to the care and education of Catholic school students.’

Archbishop Peter announced that Catholic Education Melbourne, the service arm for Catholic schools in the Archdiocese, will also move to MACS, with recently announced Executive Director of Catholic Education Melbourne, Mr Jim Miles, to serve as MACS Executive Director.

‘The contribution of Catholic education in Melbourne and greater Victoria is an ongoing fruit of the gospel and a gift of Catholic educators to Victorian society’, Archbishop Peter said. ‘Jim will continue to play a critical role, as MACS will build up the leadership, transparency and fairness of that great tradition.

‘I have no doubt that he and Gerard, along with the rest of the MACS board and staff, will continue to ensure that each Catholic school is a valued and essential community in the life of the Catholic Church, and honour the relationships of trust and friendship between school and parish communities.’

MACS will officially begin its governance responsibilities on 1 January 2021.

Australian Catholic Religious Against Trafficking in Humans (ACRATH) supports the **United Nations 16 DAYS CAMPAIGN AGAINST GENDER BASED VIOLENCE**



During the COVID-19 pandemic, reports showed an alarming increase in violence against women and girls.

**We** can Take action during this year's 16 Days of Activism to End Gender-Based Violence.

The [16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence](#) is an annual international campaign that kicks off on 25 November, the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women, and runs until 10 December, Human Rights Day.

A Webinar will be conducted on December 10, at 1.00 pm which will take the form of a prayer prepared by ACRATH members, including two from our parish, and will have a focus on violence against women and girls as well as picking up on the themes of Advent and UN Rights.
