How do you know what is in a person's heart?

For all the advances of modern science, especially the sciences of psychology and human behaviour, we human beings remain remarkably mysterious to one another. Even spouses who have spent decades in an intimate relationship can still surprise, perhaps shock, each other with unexpected disclosures or behaviours. Conscious of such complexity, we may find the biblical tradition about human nature too simplistic for our liking.

Jesus takes on board the wisdom inherited from his forebears in faith. How do you judge a person's character? How do you know what is in a person's heart? You look at their actions and you listen to their words. A person's words or actions flow from the goodness or badness in their heart. Thousands of years on, paying attention to what people say and do is still the best first thing to do, even if secrets remain.

Time and again the gospel writers report on how astonished the people were at Jesus' power to heal and at the authority of his teaching. Was it because they sensed that his words and deeds perfectly matched what was in his heart?
