Who do you say I am?

The servant of today's First Reading from the Prophet Isaiah, who suffers for the people, is promised God's help. He may well have sung today's Psalm, praising God for his salvation.

The Gospel presents Jesus as the suffering servant foretold by Isaiah, and Jesus speaks about his Passion and death for the first time here. St Mark places this scene at the centre of his Gospel. It is the turning point. He shows Jesus being met with confusion, misunderstanding and non-acceptance. The Christ (the 'anointed one') will not be the Messiah of popular expectation, but one who also embraces rejection.

Likewise, the true disciple is one who demonstrates his or her faith through good works (Second Reading). And of course, faith also calls for commitment, as we, too, try to follow the way of the cross.

Let us pray for the strength, this week, to embrace the ultimate 'good work' by doing our best to imitate Christ's loving sacrifice in our own lives, even in small ways. We ask, too, for the assurance of God's help, as we try to take up our own crosses day by day.



Antiques & Collectables Fair 2019



MECC - Volunteer Drivers Needed

The Mt Eliza Churches Community Services (MECCS) provides a much needed service in our local community enabling people with limited financial resources, who live independently, but are unable to use public transport to get to medical and other appointments.

Through the generosity of its volunteer drivers MECCS provides a free service in the area bounded by the Mornington, Mt Eliza and Frankston post code areas.

MECCS members come from the St Thomas More, the St James the Less and the Village Uniting Church faith communities. So far this year we have responded to about sixty calls for transport assistance. This is an increase on previous

years. Consequently, as the need is increasing so is our need for volunteer drivers.


