The Giving Tree Appeal is for children's gifts which will be included in the family Christmas Hampers given to disadvantaged families by the St Vincent de Paul Society this Christmas.

There is an image of a Christmas Giving Tree placed on the inside of the front door of the Church with labels attached. The labels define the age and sex of children belonging to the families we assist. There is a box placed beneath the tree in which donations of toys and other gifts can be placed. These should not be wrapped.

Parishioners are invited to take a label and to donate a gift appropriate for the age and sex of the child shown on the label. There are green labels for boys and yellow labels for girls.

The gifts, with the label attached, need to be received by the 9th December 2018 so that they can be delivered with the Christmas hampers being delivered to the families during the following week.

Bring and Buy Stall - Homemade, Handmade, Homegrown -Last Sunday Of Each Month After Each Mass

How does it work? - Just bring along anything you have made - could be food or craft - or grown. Donate it to the stall before Mass. After Mass the stall will be open, and people will be encouraged to buy! All proceeds to the Parish. Anything leftover at the end of 10am Mass (except perishable food) will



be stored to sell the following month. **Just remember...** If you are bringing food of any kind - cakes, jams, chutneys etc, they must be labelled with <u>all</u> ingredients used, the <u>date</u> they were made, and the <u>name</u> of who made it. It would be helpful if you could please price what you donate. Those running the stall have the discretion to lower prices, if need be, in order to sell goods!

GIFTS-IN-KIND FOR TIMOR LESTE

Since 2002 Salesian Missions has been sending relief goods, school furniture and school materials in containers to Timor Leste with at least five being sent each year. The containers are loaded at Salesian College Chadstone and St Thomas More Parish, Mt Eliza.

At Chadstone, the co-ordinating and packing of the goods and furniture is carried out by Fr Oreste Cantamessa and Br Joe Ellul, whilst at Mt Eliza it is organised by Les Harper and a group of loyal parishioners.

L. Arthur Transport and O'Brien Customs and Forwarding offer their logistic support and assistance in freighting the containers from Melbourne to Dili, for which we are very grateful.

Donations of furniture for the schools in Timor have come from many sources including Salesian College Chadstone, John Paul College Frankston, St Leonard's School Mt Waverley and most recently, Mt St Joseph College Altona.

Special thanks to McLure Removals, Werribee for transporting the Mt St Joseph furniture to Chadstone.

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
