#### HOMILY

## FROM UNBELIEF TO FAITH

The story about the blind man in the Gospel is not about physical blindness. This is a story about faith. The man's progress from blindness to sight symbolises the journey from unbelief to faith. The journey from unbelief to faith is a difficult one —we cannot do it alone and certainly not without the help of God. In the New Testament, we read that Jesus leads people to come to faith in him: his own disciples, the Samaritan woman at the well (3rd Sunday of Lent), Lazarus and his sisters, the man born blind, etc. Jesus also calls us to come to faith in him.

Faith is about having a personal relationship with Jesus - God. In order to develop a relationship with someone we would need ample time to get to know the person. The effective way to get to know someone is by interacting with that person over a period. Similarly, we need to have regular interaction with Jesus if we want to get to know Jesus for who he is and to enter into a relationship with him. Sometimes, we can forget that nurturing our relationship with Jesus is just as important as caring for our family, reaching out to the disadvantaged, or engaging in works of charity or social justice. It is very important that we do get the balance right so that we do not overly engaging in our missionary activities and forgetting to spend valuable times deepening our personal relationship with our special friend - Jesus. Even Jesus, in the midst of the business of his life, puts aside the time for spiritual bonding with his heavenly Father. Our good and strong relationship with Jesus will give us the energy and motivation for all our missionary activities. There may be time in the course of our life when we do not feel connected with Jesus - not being able to experience his loving presence with us. Whenever we have this experience we might want to ask ourselves - when was the last time that I had a good interaction with Jesus? Our relationship with Jesus is very similar to our relationship with other people. It can be difficult to feel connected with a friend or a relative who we do not see or talk to for years and years.

When we consider faith in terms of having a personal relationship with Jesus – we can see that faith is always relevant to our life in spite of the advancement of technology or medical science. Our true friendship with Jesus does not have an expiry date... or does it???

The season of Lent is the good opportunity for us to re-connect with Jesus – especially if we for whatever reasons have not put aside valuable time to be with Jesus.

## Pastoral Care for STM Parish during the time of the Coronavirus pandemic

This plan will be revised upon further restriction from the Government.

- 1. The church will be open for prayer and reflection on:
  - Sat: 5pm-7pm (The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed during this time)
  - Sun: 8am-11am (The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed during this time)
  - Wed to Fri: 8:30am-10am
- 2. Please remember to sanitise your hands before entering the church, and when leaving.
- 3. **Church door handles** will be sanitised at the end of each day.
- 4. **Seasons** will continue to be published online, and copies of *Seasons* will be available in the church. Homily will be included with *Seasons*.
- 5. **Pastoral visitation**: Parishioners who would like a visit from Fr Joe are to contact the parish office.
- 6. **Anointing of the Sick, and Communion for the housebound:** Those who require anointing of the sick, or those who are housebound and would like to receive Holy Communion are to contact Fr Joe at the parish office.
- 7. **Private Mass of the Priest**: Please be assured that Fr Joe will be offering Masses in private for the spiritual/temporal needs of the parishioners.
- 8. **Fr Joe is available at the parish office** from Tuesday to Sunday afternoon for parishioners to come and see him for spiritual guidance/prayer etc. Please make a booking at the office.

**Baptisms** These are held on the 1st & 3rd Sundays of each month at 11:15 am or at any of the Parish Masses on the 2nd, 4th or 5th Sundays. A compulsory preparation night for parents takes place on the first Tuesday of each month in the **Parish Community Centre at 7:30pm** The next one is scheduled for <u>Tuesday 7th April 2020</u>, however, please call the Parish Office beforehand to confirm



Children to be baptised, and their families, are then invited to a Welcome Mass prior to Baptism where they are introduced to the Parish Community and welcomed by them.

In order for this to happen, preparation needs to begin at least  $\underline{\textbf{4-6 weeks}}$  before the Baptism, with a call to confirm parents' attendance at the Preparation Night. When children of school age are to be baptised an extended preparation time is required. It is important to remember that Baptism is about the initiation of a child into a community of Faith or a community of Disciples. There is no such thing as a 'private' Baptism... it is something done by the whole Church.
