For What Do We Hunger?

Today's readings speak of our deepest needs.

In the First Reading, twenty loaves, given to Elisha the prophet in thanksgiving for the first fruits, feed over a hundred with plenty left over.

The Psalm, praises our just and loving God who generously grants all our desires.

In emphasising our vocation, St Paul, in the Second Reading, reminds us that it is God who is our Father - and that he is our unity and our peace. The Spirit enables us to live out our baptism in charity with each other.

The Gospel is the account of the feeding of the five thousand. It begins the famous chapter in St John presenting Jesus as the Bread of Life, the sacrament of unity.

Perhaps this week we can be conscious that the Lord gives himself in so many ways in our lives - and gives not just 'enough', but gives in abundance.

Baptisms



These are held on the 1st & 3rd Sundays of each month at 11:15 am or at any of the Parish Masses on the 2nd, 4th or 5th Sundays.

A compulsory preparation night for parents takes place on the first Tuesday of each month in the Parish Community Centre at 7:30 pm. Children to be baptised, and their

families, are then invited to a Welcome Mass prior to Baptism where they are introduced to the Parish Community and welcomed by them. In order for this to happen, preparation needs to begin at least <u>4-6 weeks</u> before the Baptism, with a call to confirm parents' attendance at the Preparation Night. When children of school age are to be baptised an extended preparation time is required.

It is important to remember that Baptism is about the initiation of a child into a community of Faith or a community of Disciples. There is no such thing as a 'private' Baptism... it is something done by the whole Church.
