Palm Sunday

Our quote this week is from St Francis of Assisi: "Start by doing what's necessary; then do what's possible; and suddenly you are doing the impossible."

As we make the journey with Jesus this week, the Readings call us to a revolution of heart, to take seriously our vocation as disciples of Jesus and as Isaiah reminds us to be faithful to this call and "listen like a disciple."

Our Project Compassion story features Nguyet. Nguyet and her family experienced isolation and exclusion largely based around her disability. Their lives changed when Nguyet's neighbour introduced her to the Caritas Australia supported program –

Capacity Building for Parent Associations supporting Children with Disabilities. A new world opened up for her and she discovered her creativity and her capacity to reimagine her future. She began by making colored paper flowers and dreamt of selling these to improve the livelihood of her family. Now Nguyet is selling



T-shirts, accessories and home-cooked refreshments made by her sister, as well as helping her parents with their business selling building materials. Nguyet is giving life 100%.

As we commemorate the death and resurrection of Jesus, we are also keenly aware of the humility of his life, and his refusal to remain silent in the face of the traditional attitudes and culture of rejection and exclusion experienced by the poor and marginalised – an unpopular practice then and now! Jesus' life epitomises the cost of discipleship.

This week, more than any, rams home the call and cost of discipleship. Like Isaiah we can say "The Lord has given us a disciple's tongue. So that I may know how to reply to the wearied, he provides me with speech. Each morning he wakes me to hear, to listen like a disciple."

Are we open to hearing the voice of our God who calls us to speak and listen like a disciple?

Baptisms

These are held on the 1st & 3rd Sundays of each month at 11:15 am or at any of the Parish Masses on the 2nd, 4th or 5th Sundays.

A compulsory preparation night for parents takes place on the first Tuesday of each month in the Parish Community Centre at 7:30 pm.

The next one will be on Tuesday 7th May

Children to be baptised, and their families, are then invited to a Welcome Mass prior to Baptism where they are introduced to the Parish Community and welcomed by them.

In order for this to happen, preparation needs to begin at least 4-6 weeks before the Baptism, with a call to confirm parents' attendance at the Preparation Night. When children of school age are to be baptised an extended preparation time is required. It is important to remember that Baptism is about the initiation of a child into a community of Faith or a community of Disciples. There is no such thing as a 'private' Baptism... it is something done by the whole Church.

SLAVERY FREE CHOCOLATE



We cannot ignore the fact that there is as much slavery in the world today, as there was before, or perhaps more' – said Pope Francis last month.

Australians spent around \$210 million on Easter chocolate last year. This year it will be about the same, or more. Companies will produce what we ask for. Please use your buying power and purchase slavery-free chocolate. You can make a difference to the world, and to the lives of the enslaved children who are forced to pick the cocoa beans used in a lot of chocolate.

<u>Good news</u>: Catholic agencies and institutions are leading the way in Australia in demanding slavery-free supply chains, including in the production of chocolate. Don't leave it up to the big companies.

<u>Action</u>: Please buy and eat only slavery-free Easter eggs and chocolate this Easter. Look for one of these three symbols on the chocolate wrapper and make a difference. Convert to slavery-free.

JUSTICE FOR REFUGEES

The Catholic Bishops' Conference said last Christmas about our brothers and sisters in need in offshore detention: "Enough is enough. Let's find them a home."

On Palm Sunday (14 April), there is a Palm Sunday Prayer and Reflection for those seeking asylum at the Cathedral, 383 Albert Street East Melbourne at 1 p.m., which will be followed by the Public Walk for Justice for Refugees at 2 p.m. starting at the State Library on the corner of Swanston and La Trobe streets.
