Reflection by Fr Michael Tate

Today's Gospel speaks of an advocate. This translates a Greek word: 'paraclete'. Our Lord says: 'I will send you another Paraclete to be with you forever.' Our Lord was a Paraclete, and he would send another.

What does this strange sounding word mean? Here is a hint. We all know that parallel lines run, well, para-liel. They run alongside each other. A paraclete is a person who stands alongside someone and pleads their case.

That is how our Lord Jesus Christ saw himself. His role was not to condemn but to plead the case for mercy and compassion, to be the intercessor par excellence.

Our Lord promises another Paraclete dwelling within us, individually and as the body of Christ's disciples, the Holy Spirit advocating our cause, assisting us to live Truth-fully by the measure of the One who is the Way, the Truth and the Life. This Paraclete particularly assists us by acting as the Spirit of Truth.

We could pause for a moment to thank God for the two Paracletes, constantly pleading our case before the Throne of Mercy.

First Reading Acts 8:5-8, 14-17

They laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

Philip went to a Samaritan town and proclaimed the Christ to them. The people united in welcoming the message Philip preached, either because they had heard of the miracles he worked or because they saw them for themselves. There were, for example, unclean spirits that came shrieking out of many who were possessed, and several paralytics and cripples were cured. As a result there was great rejoicing in that town.

When the apostles in Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them, and they went down there, and prayed for the Samaritans to receive the Holy Spirit, for as yet he had not come down on any of them: they had only been baptised in the name of the Lord Jesus. Then they laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

You cannot attend a Mass without making a booking. The 2 ways you can book in to attend a Mass are as follows:-

Online Bookings: For parishioners with internet access

Mass attendance will be via TryBooking. Please type TryBooking.com.au into your browser, then click on: 'Find Events' – Type in: Mass Keilor East 'Find an Event' and go to the Mass you wish to attend. Complete your booking. If all 10 spots are filled, please click on another time/day. You may book <u>one day in advance</u> of the scheduled Mass, from 9.00am-4.00pm, except for Sunday Masses, when you need to book by 4pm Friday.

Phone Bookings: For parishioners without internet access only

Please call the Parish Office on 9337 4141 by 4.00pm, the day prior to the Mass you wish to attend (except for Sunday Masses, where you need to let us know by 4.00pm on Friday), and leave your name and contact number. We will let you know if there is availability for the Mass you would like to attend.

To cater for the needs of all parishioners, I ask that you choose only one Mass to attend during the next two weeks. I encourage you to attend a weekday Mass and leave the weekend Masses time slots for those parishioners who are not able to attend weekday Masses.

I suggest you arrive at the Church approx. 10 minutes before commencement of the Mass and take your seat. Please provide your contact details as you enter the narthex and observe all the social distancing and hand sanitising requirements. If you are feeling unwell, please see stay at home but let us know if not coming. Thank you.
