#### Reflection by Fr Michael Tate

When he was crucified Jesus uttered: 'It is finished.' What had finished? His earthly ministry during which he painted a picture of the most intimate communion between Himself, the Father, and the Holy Spirit, so intimate that the Church needed a new word: 'Tri-Unity' or 'Trinity' for short.

God is pulsating, shimmering light, dancing in threefold exchange of love, each being simultaneously poured into the other. God is 'Being-In-Love' and love is always relational.

'You are made in the image and likeness of God'? Because of the ministry of Jesus Christ, we know what that really means. We are made to live in relationship – not in solitary.

If we think that the ultimate good is to be self-sufficient/autonomous, that leads to a hellish existence. When we live with as much self-giving as is possible, we are on the way to a heavenly existence.

We could pause for a moment to give thanks for the revelation of the nature of God, and consequently of the true nature of human beings.

Add your details and confirm booking. If all 20 spots are filled, you will not be able to book that particular Mass time. Bookings for Masses at 6pm, 8.30am and 10.30am on the weekend of 13th/14th June, will open at 9am on Tuesday, 9th June and close at 5.00pm on Friday 12th June, unless filled earlier.

## Phone Bookings: For parishioners without internet access only

Please call the Parish Office on 9337 4141 from Tuesday 9nd June. We will let you know if there is availability for the weekend Mass you wish to attend, and book you in if requested.

If you know of any parishioners who may not be aware that Masses have resumed in our Parish, please let us know so we can contact them and give them priority to attend. It would also be appreciated if those who have booked more than twice so far, give others the opportunity to attend a Mass, especially weekend Masses.

If you are feeling unwell, please stay at home but let us know if you have booked but are not attending a Mass. The health and wellbeing of our parishioners and our community remain our number one priority.

Our weekend Masses are still being streamed from Saturday evening and will continue until we are able to accommodate all parishioners in the Church once again.

#### **CURRENT COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS**

## JUNE: MONTH OF THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS



The month of June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, with the Church celebrating the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus on the Friday following the second Sunday after Pentecost(19th June 2020). In addition to the liturgical celebration, many devotional exercises are connected with the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Of all devotions, devotion to the Sacred Heart was, and remains, one of the most widespread and popular in the Church.

Understood in the light of the Scriptures, the term 'Sacred Heart of Jesus' denotes the entire mystery of Christ, the totality of his being, and his person considered in its most intimate essentials: Son of God, uncreated wisdom; infinite charity, principal of the salvation and sanctification of mankind. The 'Sacred Heart' is Christ, the Word Saviour, intrinsically Incarnate, containing in the Spirit, an infinite divine-human love for the Father and for this brothers.
