

Shepherd me O Lord

The concept of the shepherd watching over the sheep has always taken on a biblical theme of the Lord watching over his creation. For pastoral people this image is very real. For us these images take on a significance as we consider our Scripture today. The Lord chose Samuel and then David to be the shepherd of his presence in the world. The Israelites sang the song we know so well offer-

ing images of the shepherd enveloping the sheep with loving care.

The Gospel also contains for us the image of Jesus being the shepherd offering sight, loving care and compassion, while we also consider the challenge of those who were not prepared to be supported, those who rejected the shepherd. We might also ourselves: Do we allow the Lord to be our light, our shepherd, our guide, our eyes?

Entrance Antiphon: Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast.

Responsorial Psalm: The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want.

LENT

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fasting and Abstinence from meat.

On all other Fridays, except solemnities, the law of the common practice of penance is fulfilled by performing any one of the following:

Prayer - for example, Mass attendance; family prayer; a visit to a church or chapel; reading the Bible; making the Stations of the Cross; praying the Rosary; or in other ways.

Self-Denial - for example, not eating meat; not eating sweets or dessert; giving up entertainment to spend time with the family; limiting food and drink so as to give to the poor of one's own country or elsewhere; or in other ways. Project Compassion is a major means of expressing our self-denial in Australia.

Helping Others - for example, special attention to someone who is poor, sick, elderly, lonely or over-burdened; or in other ways.

- All who have completed their eighteenth year and have not yet begun their sixtieth year are bound to fast. All who have completed their fourteenth year are bound to abstain (Canon 1252).
