# **The Most Holy Trinity**

Everyone of us loves and believes in God. Even though we find it hard to understand we trust because we have a belief in the one who has shared with us the relationship of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. We know each time we make the Sign of the Cross and say those words, we are expressing this belief and faith.

We hear in our Gospel: "God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost".

During the Last Supper Jesus shared with his friends the interrelationship between the Father and the Holy Spirit. This is the basis for our belief today.

Love is the focus and the emergence of this aspect of God who manifests for us the very essence of love. We all know what it means to love and be loved and that is what God is. Perhaps we come close to understanding the Trinity, when we ponder a loving couple who give birth to their child. Each a part of each other yet separate and distinct. **Entrance Antiphon:** Blest be God the Father, and the Only Begotten Son of God, and also the Holy Spirit, for he has shown us his merciful love.
