#### **GREETINGS FROM ROME**

Fortunately the weather in Rome has cooled yet is still very mild. It is wonderful to see the transition as many trees have lost their leaves and there are autumn colours still about. During the month of October our lectures continued reflecting on Canon Law, particularly related to priests. We also reflected on Catholic Social Teaching, reminding us of the importance to care for these who are marginalised, even if the focus was very centred on the Untied States of America. Might I say there is a heavy American presence here. Other input has been on Theology, priesthood and the role of the laity in the life of the parish. I have been reflecting on our own Pastoral Renewal program and the importance of this in our lives as a community, in the light of these lectures. We were fortunate to have a presentation from the Congregation for the Causes of Saints, offering insights on the process for the canonization of those who have been considered or promoted.

As well as the lectures here in the College we have been fortunate to have tours around Rome. We have visited two of the 'Dicaseries'. Offices of the Vatican, firstly for the Clergy and secondly for New Evangelization. One visit to highlight was through the Vatican Gardens. We walked through the gardens and I was amazed at the complexity and variety of the vegetation. Pope Emeritus Benedict resides in these gardens and I was fortunate to see him as he was farewelling some guests as their car was departing. During the week we toured the Basilica of St Clement, one of my favourites and also the Basilica of St John Lateran. One weekend I went to Florence and once again enjoyed the beauty and history of this ancient and historical town. In mid October we had a ten day semester break and the priests on Sabbatical went in all directions. I have always wanted to spend time in North Italy in the alps, so I took the opportunity to go to Bressanone (Italian) or Brixen (German), south of Brennen, in the South Tyrol. The village is in the valley with towering mountains on either side. The scenery was exquisite, while the air was cold and sunny except for two days when it snowed. I walked heaps, had many train rides and enjoyed the break, and the food, while taking lots of photos. Last weekend I went to Venice and again enjoyed the quaint buildings rising from the waterways, fortunately before the water flooded during this week.

As I enjoy each day with time for study and adventure I remember you in my thoughts and prayer. Every blessing, Fr Peter
