Body & Blood Of Christ

This feast of the Body & Blood of Christ is the focal point of our relationship with our God. Jesus clearly explains the union we have with Him when we share in the gift of the Eucharist. How can we not partake if we believe in Jesus? Here below are the words of Jesus: (John 6:51-58)

"I am the living bread that came down from heaven. If anyone eats from this bread he will live forever. The bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh."Then the Jews who were hostile to Jesus began to argue with one another, How can this man give us his flesh to eat?"Jesus said to them, I tell you the solemn truth, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in yourselves. The one who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. The one who eats my flesh and drinks my blood resides in me, and I in him. Just as the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so the one who consumes me will live because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven; it is not like the bread your ancestors ate, but then later died. The one who eats this bread will live forever." **Entrance Antiphon:** He fed them with the finest wheat and satisfied them with honey from the rock.
