LAUDATO SI' A SUMMARY

The Encyclical takes its name from the invocation of Saint Francis of Assisi, "Praise be to you, my Lord" which in the Canticle of the Creatures reminds us that the earth, our common home "is like a sister with whom we share our life and a beautiful mother who opens her arms to embrace us" (1). We ourselves "are dust of the earth (cf. Gen 2:7); our very bodies are made up of her elements, we breathe her air and we receive life and refreshment from her waters" (2). "This sister now cries out to us because of the harm we have inflicted on her by our irresponsible use and abuse of the goods with which God has endowed her" (2). Her cry, united with that of the poor, stirs our conscience to "acknowledge our sins against creation" (8). Taking the words of the "beloved" Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew, the Pope reminds us: "For human beings... to destroy the biological diversity ... by causing changes in its climate ...; to contaminate the earth's waters, its land, its air, and its life – these are sins" (8).

The appropriate response to such penitence is what St John Paul II already called a "global ecological conversion" (5). In this, St Francis of Assisi is "the example par excellence of care for the vulnerable and of an integral ecology lived out joyfully and authentically. [...] He shows us just how inseparable is the bond between concern for nature, justice for the poor, commitment to society, and interior peace" (10).

Entrance Antiphon: Your merciful love, O God, we have received in the midst of your temple. Your praise, O God, like your name, reaches the ends of the earth; your right hand is filled with saving justice.

Responsorial Psalm: Our eyes are fixed on the Lord, pleading for his mercy.

<u>Gospel Acclamation:</u> Alleluia, Alleluia! The spirit of the Lord is upon me; he sent me to bring Good News to the poor. Alleluia!

<u>Communion Antiphon:</u> Taste and see that the Lord is good; blessed the man who seeks refuge in him.
