OPENING OF THE HOLY DOOR, ST PATRICK'S CATHEDRAL

Sunday 13 December, 2.30pm St Patrick's Cathedral, Cathedral Place, East Melbourne
In announcing the Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy, Pope Francis asked that a special holy door be opened in every diocese, 'to allow everyone in every part of the world to experience the Mercy of the Father ... the Holy Door will become a Door of Mercy through which anyone who enters will experience the love of God who consoles, pardons and instils hope.' (Misericordiae Vultus) To mark the opening of the Jubilee in Melbourne, Archbishop Denis Hart will open a special Holy Door of Mercy on Sunday 13 December at 2.30pm. Program highlights: • Opening of the local Door of Mercy by Archbishop Denis Hart at 2.30pm • Food stalls, music and activities hosted by Aboriginal Catholic Ministry, CatholicCare, Catholic Mission, Melbourne Vocations Office, and more! • Hour of adoration and prayer led by Bishop Vincent Long OFMconv at 4pm Pilgrims are advised to arrive as early as 2pm, as we anticipate a large crowd for the official opening of the Door of Mercy at 2.30pm.

ST PATRICK'S CATHEDRAL ANNUAL FESTIVAL OF READINGS, PRAYERS AND CAROLS Friday 11 December, 7.30pm St Patrick's Cathedral, Cathedral Place, East Melbourne. St Pat's will once again resound with the glorious music of Advent and Christmas when the annual Festival of Readings, Prayers and Carols is held on Friday 11 December. The tradition of the carol service dates only from the late nineteenth century, but its deepest origins may be found in the great tradition of the daily prayer of the Church, whose customary nine readings and responsories provide the basis for the structure of the modern service as we know it. The service will conclude with Benediction as principal celebrant Archbishop Denis Hart places the Blessed Sacrament in the monstrance and enthrones it upon the altar. Directed by Dr Daryl Barclay and accompanied by organist Mr Dion Henman, the St Patrick's Cathedral Choir will lead the various carols, and also sing a variety of sacred works expressing the profound mysteries of Advent and Christmas.

PRAYER OF POPE FRANCIS FOR THE JUBILEE

Lord Jesus Christ, you have taught us to be merciful like the heavenly Father, and have told us that whoever sees you sees Him.

Show us your face and we will be saved. Your loving gaze freed Zacchaeus and Matthew from being enslaved by money; the adulteress and Magdalene from seeking happiness only in created things; made Peter weep after his betrayal, and assured Paradise to the repentant thief. Let us hear, as if addressed to each one of us, the words that you spoke to the Samaritan woman: "If you knew the gift of God!"

You are the visible face of the invisible Father, of the God who manifests his power above all by forgiveness and mercy: let the Church be your visible face in the world, its Lord risen and glorified. You willed that your ministers would also be clothed in weakness in order that they may feel compassion for those in ignorance and error: let everyone who approaches them feel sought after, loved, and forgiven by God.

Send your Spirit and consecrate every one of us with its anointing, so that the Jubilee of Mercy may be a year of grace from the Lord, and your Church, with renewed enthusiasm, may bring good news to the poor, proclaim liberty to captives and the oppressed, and restore sight to the blind.

We ask this through the intercession of Mary, Mother of Mercy, you who live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit for ever and ever. Amen.

Responsorial Psalm: The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy.
