If somebody complained because you eat with sinners, spoke with the neglected and even welcomed them, I am sure you would say it is only right to do so.

In our Gospel this weekend Jesus uses three parables to highlight what he is doing. The sinner in the eyes of Jesus are those who are lost and need to be cared for, to be respected, to be welcomed. It is what we see Jesus doing all the time. He is criticized for his outreach, his compassion, his respect for all and the way he cares for those who are the outcast, in the eyes of the Pharisees.

The Pharisees considered themselves righteous and proper, the chosen and above others. It is for this reason Jesus challenges them to take a good look at themselves.

We are, in the eyes of Jesus, the lost sheep, the lost drachma, the son who went and wasted his father's inheritance, for we are the sinners, who Jesus welcomes and rejoices when we recognize we re in need of his touch, his embrace, his support. Hence our need to respect and welcome all who come into our lives.
