The Ascension of the Lord

The culmination of the public ministry of Jesus is celebrated today. From the Scriptures in the Old Testament we read of the revelation of our God to his people. God expressed his love for us by offering to send One who would save us from our own downfalls, our own sinfulness -The Messiah.

The coming of Jesus as the Son of God brings to us the love of God manifested in a human being like ourselves. The public ministry of Christ is related to us through the Gospel Writers, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, as the inspired Word of God, God speaking to us through their words.

Jesus came to bring us freedom and offer us a loving support through His Word and Sacraments, particularly the gift of the Eucharist, the Body of Christ, we receive in Holy Communion.

CHURCH RADIANT HEATERS

The new radiant heaters have been fully installed. We investigated the most effective way to provide heating in our Church. The consultant's report stated: "Radian heaters are preferred over heating the Church for the following reason:- They are fast to heat up and heat like the sun, i.e. they directly heat the person. The volume is too large that heating the air is costly. The space is naturally ventilated and has large leaks which would inhibit effective heating of the air. The space is not in use for large periods which makes justification of large air conditioning".

Radiant heaters do not heat the air. The infrared rays from the heaters warms the person without heating the whole building. To be warmed by the heaters you need to sit in sight of the rays.
