# Taste and see the goodness of the Lord

The Gospel readings from the evangelist John conclude today, as we hear some of those present, to hear the words of Jesus, not accepting what he said. It is Peter who utters words of recognition and faith: Lord, who shall we go to? You have the message of eternal life, and we believe ; we know you that you are the Holy One of God."

## Are you also able to make this act of faith?

Perhaps in the words of the Psalm we again find an answer for we are invited to 'taste and see'. Taste is that which allows us to make a choice as to whether we like or dislike something we place in our mouth. Using our eyes also gives us the ability to also make a choice as to whether we like or dislike what we are looking at. Constantly we are tasting and seeing, making choices and discerning all the things that come our way.

As we conclude these Gospel readings from John's account of the life of Jesus we must answer the question presented to us by Jesus, **"What about you, do you want to go away too?**
