Choices

Everyone of us has to make choices constantly. It is part of daily life. So we might ask ourselves:- What sort of choices do I make? Do I make a choice out of fear, out of love, out of uncertainty, out of conviction, out of necessity, out of truthfulness or just make a choice without caring? Think of your response to these questions. Then - What do you expect from others, especially those who are part of your everyday life?

Jesus uses a wonderful example to help us reflect. It is obvious who made the better choice. Jesus invites us to consider the appropriate choice even when we may not have done so at first. So how might we be open to the riches that are offered to us to help us grow, to be truthful and honest.

The point here is that we are able to grow and use the past as an example for improvement in our lives. We may not always make the right choice, yet we can learn from it. Jesus reminds us that to make a right choice, then reject it or go the other way, is not really a loving act.
