

## CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

**90.** Did the incarnate Son of God have a soul with human knowledge? The Son of God assumed a body animated by a rational human soul. With his human intellect Jesus learned many things by way of experience; but also as man the Son of God had an intimate and immediate knowledge of God his Father. He likewise understood people's secret thoughts and he knew fully the eternal plans which he had come to reveal.

**91.** How did the two wills of the incarnate Word cooperate? Jesus had a divine will and a human will. In his earthly life the Son of God humanly willed all that he had divinely decided with the Father and the Holy Spirit for our salvation. The human will of Christ followed without opposition or reluctance the divine will or, in other words, it was subject to it.

**92.** Did Christ have a true human body? Christ assumed a true human body by means of which the invisible God became visible. This is the reason why Christ can be represented and venerated in sacred images.

**93.** What does the heart of Jesus exemplify? Jesus knew us and loved us with a human heart. His Heart, pierced for our salvation, is the symbol of that infinite love with which he loves the Father and each one of us.

## "The Holy Spirit changes hearts"

In his homily on Pentecost Sunday delivered before thousands of the faithful gathered in St Peter's Basilica, Pope Francis focused on the action of the Holy Spirit expressed in the Scripture readings from the Acts of the Apostles, St Paul's letter to the Galatians, and St John's Gospel. The Spirit transforms the hearts of the timid disciples from fearful men, "huddled behind closed doors", to bold men who "bear witness to Jesus" (John 15:27), the Pope said. His action frees hearts, impels service, guides people in new directions, and makes "the lukewarm thrill to new dreams. That is what it means to change hearts", Pope Francis said.

Pope Francis suggests that since the Holy Spirit provokes change that we turn to Him for a "powerful 'jolt' " when "we are in need of real change". He is "the power of God" and the "giver of life". "How good it would be for us each day to feel this jolt of life! To say when we wake up each morning: 'Come, Holy Spirit, come into my heart, come into my day' ", the Pope said.

The Holy Spirit "penetrates the most unimaginable situations", Pope Francis continued. He does so today just as he did in the Acts of the Apostles.

Was anything ever heard? Did ever a people hear the voice of the living God speaking from the heart of the fire, as you heard it, and remain alive? Has any god ventured to take to himself one nation from the midst of another by ordeals, signs, wonders, war with mighty hand and outstretched arm, by fearsome terrors? All this that the Lord your God did for you before your eyes in Egypt.' 'Understand this today, therefore, and take it to heart: The Lord is God indeed, in heaven above as on earth beneath, he and no other. Keep his laws and commandments as I give them to you today so that you and your children may prosper and live long in the land that the Lord your God gives you for ever.'

## (R.) Happy the people the Lord has chosen to be his own.

The word of the Lord is faithful and all his works to be trusted. The Lord loves justice and right and fills the earth with his love. (R.)

With his word the heavens were made, by the breath of his mouth all the stars. He spoke; and they came to be. He commanded; they sprang into being. (R.)

The Lord looks on those who revere him, on those who hope in his love, to rescue their souls from death, to keep them alive in famine. (R.)

Our soul is waiting for the Lord. The Lord is our help and our shield. May your love be upon us, O Lord, as we place all our hope in you. (R.)

## **SECOND READING** (*Rom* 8:14-17)

Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son of God. The spirit you received is not the spirit of slaves bringing fear into your lives again; it is the spirit of sons, and it makes us cry out, 'Abba, Father!' The Spirit himself and our spirit bear united witness that we are children of God. And if we are children we are heirs as well:

heirs of God and coheirs with Christ, sharing his sufferings so as to share his glory.

### **GOSPEL ACCLAMATION**

Alleluia, alleluia! Glory to the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit: to God who is, who was, and who is to come. Alleluia!

## **GOSPEL** (*Mathew* 28:16-20)


The eleven disciples set out for Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had arranged to meet them. When they saw him they fell down before him, though some hesitated. Jesus came up and spoke to them.
