REFLECTION

Everything is new! There is a new law of love, a new heaven and earth that is established in the church, a new depth of communion there, and a new glory of God that shines forth from its members.

The new commandment that Jesus announces is more than tolerance or mutual respect. It requires self-sacrificing love. Perhaps the greatest obstacle to this love is the diversity discussed last Sunday. It is hard enough to love those who are like us; how can we possibly love those who are different? And how can we love those who do not love us? It is no wonder that the commandment is called new. It calls for something completely different.

The new commandment is the law of the new heaven and the new earth that are established in the new Jerusalem. Standards are entirely different there. The greater ones serve; the meek possess the earth; happy are the poor; woe to those who laugh. This is clearly a city that comes down from heaven, not one made by human hands. It is a city that embraces all who come to it. God dwells in the midst of this city, in the heart of this people. God dwells with them and they dwell with God.

Through this new love, this new heaven and new earth, this new depth of communion, the glory of God is manifested in a new way. The eschatological future is anticipated in the present. The age of fulfilment has dawned.

FOLLOW-UP TO AUSTRALIAN BISHOPS CONFERENCE MAY 2021

Last May the Australian Bishops decided to celebrate Laudato Si' Week from 16 - 24 May during each year of their seven-year Laudato Si' Action Plan journey. These dates allow both Laudato Si' Week, and National Reconciliation Week from 27 May - 3 June, to be celebrated appropriately by Australian Catholics. The dates were announced in the Social Justice Statement Cry of the Earth, Cry of the Poor.



Monday 16th May 2022: Welcome to Laudato Si' Week 2022

From the Encyclical: "The urgent challenge to protect our common home includes a concern to bring the whole human family together... for we know that things can change." Laudato Si'n 13.

Prayer: Gracious God, you are good to all and compassionate to all your works. As we commence Laudato Si' Week, we are mindful of your generous love in all creation, we acknowledge the traditional owners of the land on which we live, we accept your invitation to engage with the wisdom of Laudato Si'. With Pope Francis, concerned citizens and all creation, we commit to the call and challenge of the week ahead, so that, in prayer and protest, silence and song, reflection and renewal, we might live the Easter promise of love's triumph. We make this prayer in the name of Jesus, our risen Lord, through the power of the Holy Spirit, now and forever. Amen.

Tuesday 17th May 2022: Goal 1—The Cry of the Earth

From the Encyclical: "Living our vocation to be protectors of God's handiwork is essential to a life of cirtue; it is not an optional or a secondary aspect of our Christian experience." Laudato Si' n 217

Prayer: God of peace, you call us to act out of love, not fear. The earth is full of wonders that sing of your goodness. May we, your friends, make known the glorious splendour of your kingdom. Incline the ear of our heart to the cry of the earth, oceans and skies. Humble our desire for dominance over creation. Soften our engagement with our brother earth and sister sky, our cousin, the kookaburra, and friend, the spreading fern. Lead us move from awe to awareness, tears to togetherness, and from wonder to work for justice for all. We make this prayer in the name of Jesus, our risen Lord, through the power of the Holy Spirit, now and forever. Amen.

Wednesday 18th May 2022: Goal 2—The Cry of the Poor

From the Encyclical: "Strategies for a solution demand an integrated approach to combatting poverty, restoring dignity to the excluded, and at the same time protecting nature." Laudato Si' n 139

Prayer: God of mercy, you draw near to hear the cry of the poor. From the edges, hear our cry. From women abusive relationships, hear our cry. From parents struggling to care for children, hear our cry. From those dispossessed of land and lore, hear our cry. From those excluded from public spaces and policy, hear our cry. From those made poor by unjust structures and systems, hear our cry. From our humble hears, hear our cry. We make this prayer in the name of Jesus, our risen Lord, through the power of the Holy Spirit, now and forever. Amen.

Thursday 19th May 2022: Goal 3—Ecological Economics

From the Encyclical: "The emptier a person's heart is, the more he or she needs to buy, own and consume." Laudato Si' n 204 Prayer: God of justice, you govern the peoples with equity. You gift us with creation as a common good, not a commodity. You gift us with sisters and brothers made in your image, not as tools. You gift us with minds that question, not quell. Help us to imagine an economy that: promotes connection and community, honours dignity and dialogue, leads to gratuity, not greed. May our reflection today give a soul to the economy of tomorrow. We make this prayer in the name of Jesus, our risen Lord, through the power of the Holy Spirit, now and forever. Amen.

Friday 20th May 2022: Goal 4— Adoption of Sustainable Lifestyles

From the Encyclical: "Reusing something instead of immediately discarding it, when done for the right reasons, can be an act of love which expresses our own dignity." Laudato Si; n 211

Prayer: Loving God, your mercy towers to the heavens, and your faithfulness to the skies. May your love temper our desire for more. May your love shape lifestyles that lead to life for all. May your love guide our steps towards sustainability. May your love be enough. We make this prayer in the name of Jesus, our risen Lord, through the power of the Holy Spirit, now and forever. Amen.

Saturday 21st May 2022: Goal 5—Ecological Education

From the Encyclical: "Ecological education can take place in a variety of settings: at school, in families, in the media, in catechesis and elsewhere. Good education plants seeds when we are young, and these continue to bear fruit throughout life."

Prayer: God of truth, you are good and your kindness ensures forever. In your Son, Jesus, you give us a teacher who: fills our minds with questions and concerns, daring and discomfort, opens our eyes to the brokenness and blessedness of our world, enlarges our hearts with love for all, and propels our bodies toward those in most need. Humbly, we place before you our unknowing and desire for truth. Help us to learn from our land, from the First Peoples, the young, and those made poor. Fifth Sunday of Easter — Year C-15 May 2022

Entrance Antiphon: O sing a new song to the Lord, for he has worked wonders; in the sight of the nations he has shown his deliverance, alleluia.

First Reading: Acts 14:21-27

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

Paul and Barnabas went back through Lystra and Iconium to Antioch. They put fresh heart into the disciples, encouraging them to persevere in the faith. 'We all have to experience many hardships' they said 'before we enter the kingdom of God.' In each of these churches they appointed elders, and with prayer and fasting they commended them to the Lord in whom they had come to believe.

They passed through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. Then after proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia and from there sailed for Antioch, where they had originally been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now completed.
