BREAKING OPEN THE WORD—READING THE SIGNS

One of the major themes of the first half of John's gospel is whether people have the capacity to understand the meaning of the signs that Jesus worked. Time and again, a sign is worked but only partially comprehended. In the coming weeks the true meaning of the feeding of the multitude will be our focus. The ministry of Jesus was having enormous success. His healing of the sick had attracted such a crowd that 200 denarii (over half a year's wages for a labourer) would only be sufficient to give them a small piece of bread each. Like Elisha before him, Jesus will work with what is at hand so that the people will not go hungry. In both cases what is at hand is minimal, but the resulting surplus is a powerful sign of what can happen when the Lord is given room to work with what we have to offer. When Jesus is at work there is always more than is needed, just as the fullness of his identity and mission cannot be exhausted by the crowd's perception that he is a prophet and king. Paul knew that the abundance of the life that we have received in baptism is meant to be shared. If we have understood the gift we have been given then we will understand that we too are called to be a sign for the world. Our unity and charity towards one another are a sign of the life we share in Jesus, the living bread and source of our lives.

UPDATE ON ST KEVIN'S PRIMARY SCHOOL, ORMOND

Dear Parishioners, I am sure you have been waiting to hear about the future of our school. I, along with the Parish Finance Committee and Archdiocesan Property and Infrastructure advisors have reviewed options of the premises in line with the Parish's mission and ongoing needs. We have further considered the option to retain the ownership of the premises with the possibility of entering into a short to medium term lease with a third party. In doing so, the Parish sought 'request for proposal' from commercial leasing agents to act as agent on behalf of the Parish. Following review of the requests and further discussion, **Teskacarson** has been engaged as the leasing agent for the premises. The premises will be advertised 'for lease by expressions of interest' with the campaign to commence in the coming weeks over a 12-week period. The intention of the EOI is to seek the interest from the market for a short to medium term lease for educational purposes. Following the EOI campaign, the Parish will assess the submissions and select a suitable tenant and enter into a lease for the premises. This allows the Parish to maintain ownership of the premises while receiving a stable income for the term of the lease.



Gospel: Jn 6: 1-15

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John.

Jesus went off to the other side of the Sea of Galilee—or of Tiberias—and a large crowd followed him, impressed by the signs he gave by curing the sick. Jesus climbed the hillside and sat down there with his disciples. It was shortly before the Jewish feast of Passover.

Looking up, Jesus saw the crowds approaching and said to Philip, 'Where can we buy some bread for these people to eat?' He only said this to test Philip; he himself knew exactly what he was going to do. Philip answered, 'Two hundred denarii would only buy enough to give them a small piece each.' One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said, 'There is a small boy here with five barley loaves and two fish; but what is that between so many?' Jesus said to them, 'Make the people sit down.' There was plenty of grass there, and as many as five thousand men sat down. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and gave them out to all who were sitting ready; he then did the same with the fish, giving out as much as was wanted. When they had eaten enough he said to the disciples, 'Pick up the pieces left

over, so that nothing gets wasted.' So they picked them up, and filled twelve hampers with scraps left over from the meal of five barley loaves. The people, seeing this sign that he had given, said, 'This really is the prophet who is to come into the world.' Jesus, who could see they were about to come and take him by force and make him king, escaped back to the hills by himself.
