Gospel John 12:20-33

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

If a grain of wheat falls on the ground and dies, it yields a rich harvest.

Among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks.

These approached Philip, who came from Bethsaida in Galilee, and put this request to him, 'Sir, we should like to see Jesus.' Philip went to tell Andrew, and Andrew and Philip together went to tell Jesus. Jesus replied to them:

'Now the hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. I tell you most solemnly, unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies.

it remains only a single grain; but if it dies.

it vields a rich harvest.

Anyone who loves his life loses it; anyone who hates his life in this world will keep it for the eternal life.

If a man serves me, he must follow me, wherever I am, my servant will be there too.

If anyone serves me, my Father will honour him.

Now my soul is troubled. What shall I say:

Father, save me from this hour? But it was for this very reason that I

have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name!'

A voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.'

People standing by, who heard this, said it was a clap of thunder; others said, 'It was an angel speaking to him.' Jesus answered, 'It was not for my sake that this voice came, but for yours.

'Now sentence is being passed on this world:

now the prince of this world is to be overthrown.

And when I am lifted up from the earth, I shall draw all men to myself.'

By these words he indicated the kind of death he would die.



REFLECTION by Fr. Thomas Toretkiu The Hour has Come: Everything that happens, happens in God's timeline (Ecc 3.1). No one knows the hour, not even the angels in heaven but only God (Jn 24:36). Before the hour no one could arrest him nor lay their hands on him because the hour had not yet come (Jn 7.30). "Now the hour has come (Jn 12:23). God's moment of eschatological fulfillment gathers together in His time, in the sense of the past, present, and future. It is all about the moment of decision and it was for this purpose that the Son of man came to be glorified. The hour brings a new covenant, an interior relationship with God. It is a commitment of the heart to hold life for self-centeredness or to pass it on to the will of God. The Gospel passage begins with some Greeks; Andrew and Philip, non-Jews came to 'see Jesus' trying to perceive Jesus. This is a response to a possible future. The hour brings blessings with a price, "I tell you most solemnly unless a wheat of grain falls on the ground and dies, it remains only a single grain; but if it dies. it yields a rich harvest" (Jn 12:24). Jesus is that grain of wheat buried in the earth, which rises to new life, fruitful for you and me and the whole of humanity. Jesus was lifted on the cross and triumph over his enemies. His enthronement is a true King, not only of Israel but of the whole world which has being under the rule of evil. The uplifted bronze is the emblem that brought healing from the poison of deadly stung vipers, rebellion, and disobedience (Nm 21:9). Jesus in anguish said "now my soul is troubled," "Father, save me from this hour?" But it was for this very reason that He had come to this hour, to glorify God's name. He could have chosen to avoid the cross, the scandal, and shame, but for our sake and for our salvation. He courageously chose to suffer and die. Jesus our Savior and Lord draws all humanity to Himself. Jesus shows and gives us new hope and joy in all the days of our life. What are the images of a grain of wheat-related to your life? Do you hope in the Lord and follow joyfully the path he has chosen for you?
