Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B

The Voice which Accompanies to the Other Side

Every element of the universe, even the most destructive, is listening for the voice of Our Lord, "Quiet, be still." In this Gospel story, the waters of chaos respond to the voice of the Lord of all creation, allowing Jesus to accompany his disciples to the other side of the Sea of Galilee.

We all know of times when chaos storms into our life, when we feel we are being swamped whether from outside or from some part of our own personality. Some part of our life is facing death. We may cry out to Jesus "Don't you care?".

He *will* come to accompany us but always to "the other side". Our Lord does not indulge the fantasy of "turning back the clock". We have to keep rowing in a new direction. There is no nostalgic return to the old situation. We may well feel displaced, disoriented, but Our Lord is our companion in the unfamiliar situation we have reached.

We could take a moment to pray for Our Lord to help us in all life-threatening situations, especially in the final transit through the wrenching chaos of death. May we hear him rebuke the Prince of Darkness and Death: "Quiet, be still" as he accompanies us to the other side, to the promised land of Heaven.

boat; and there were other boats with him. Then it began to blow a gale and the waves were breaking into the boat so that it was almost swamped. But he was in the stern, his head on the cushion, asleep. They woke him and said to him, 'Master, do you not care? We are going down!' And he woke up and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, 'Quiet now! Be calm!' And the wind dropped, and all was calm again. Then he said to them, 'Why are you so frightened? How is it that you have no faith?' They were filled with awe and said to one another, 'Who can this be? Even the wind and the sea obey him.'

"CONCERN SERVICE HELPING OTHERS"

Pastoral Care Ministry at St Patrick's Murrumbidgee has initiated this program to Care for Parishioners who need help during this difficult period where all of us are affected by the Covid Crisis.

This program will be managed by Parishioners who volunteer their time to help those Parishioners who need urgent help and this will initially be for a three month period.

We need two Co-ordinators in each of the following areas who will be contacted directly by those needing assistance.

1. Emergency Meals
2. Transport
3. Visitation to the Aged and Housebound

We need around 6 Volunteers to assist the Co-ordinators in providing the required services to the Parishioners needing help in the areas listed above.
