"This parish has been my spiritual home for my almost 60 years, even when I've lived interstate (my family home and family members were still living and active in the parish then). I was baptised in the old church in 1958 -- a few months before it burnt down -- received the Sacraments of Reconciliation, Holy Communion and Confirmation for the first time in the present church, in which my sister was married, my father remarried after Mum's death and from which my parents and paternal grandparents were buried. I went to school at what was then Blessed Oliver Plunkett's (BOPs) and in 1975, we celebrated our parish patron's canonisation here. For about 30 years from the 1950s, Pallottine priests celebrated two of our six Sunday Masses and I have been involved with them -- as have a number of other parishioners -- ever since, including for two years as a lay missionary in WA in the 1980s. Other than these "big" links, the regular connection with my parish community helps sustain me in my Catholic faith and -although much of how that faith is expressed is done elsewhere -- helps me try to live it out more widely, with God's help" - Mark Brolly
