

#### FIRST READING:

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

The prize of his victory is with him, his trophies all go before him. He is like a shepherd feeding his flock, gathering lambs in his arms, holding them against his breast and leading to their rest the mother ewes.



#### **SECOND READING:**

A reading from the second letter of St Peter We wait for new heavens and a new earth.

There is one thing, my friends, that you must never forget: that with the Lord, 'a day' can mean a thousand years, and a thousand years is like a day. The Lord is not being slow to carry out his promises, as anybody else might be called slow; but he is being patient with you all, wanting nobody to be lost and everybody to be brought to change his ways. The Day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then with a roar the sky will vanish, the elements will catch fire and fall apart, the earth and all that it contains will be burnt up.

Since everything is coming to an end like this, you should be living holy and saintly lives while you wait and long for the Day of God to come, when the sky will dissolve in flames and the elements melt in the heat. What we are waiting for is what he promised: the new heavens and new earth, the place where righteousness will be at home. So then, my friends, while you are waiting, do your best to live lives without spot or stain so that he will find you at peace.

#### Isaiah:

and so it was that John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. All Judaea and all the people of Jerusalem made their way to him, and as they were baptised by him in the river Jordan they confessed their sins. John wore a garment of camel-skin, and he lived on locusts and wild honey. In the course of his preaching he said, 'Someone is following me, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to kneel down and undo the strap of his sandals. I have baptised you with water, but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit.'

#### REGISTERING FOR WEEKEND MASSES

Reconfiguration of the Church has been carried out over the past few days. Therefore, from this weekend (5/6 December) the numbers permitted to attend Mass has increased to **50**.



There are two Masses being offered this weekend – Saturday 6.00pm and Sunday 10.00am.

All parishioners are now welcome to register for any weekend Mass they wish to attend. Bookings for next weekend's Masses (December 12/13) will commence through Trybooking https://www.trybooking.com/BNIWQ on Monday 7th December at 9.00am and conclude on Friday 11<sup>th</sup> December at 11.00am (or prior if masses are completely booked out beforehand). When registering you need a confirmation email which is immediately sent to your email address. If you don't receive a confirmation email from trybooking, then please contact Chris on 0401 112 380 or whoever is on duty to confirm.

Contact tracing details remains a requirement for the foreseeable future. Therefore, attending Mass is by registration only.

If you are booked in and are then unable to attend Mass at your allocated time, please contact Fr. Alan on 0410894651 so that your place can be allocated to another parishioner. Please give as much notice as possible.

Those attending Mass are required to be there <u>30 minutes before</u> the commencement of each Mass. <u>10 minutes before</u> the start of the Mass the doors of the Church will be closed and no further admittance will be allowed.

Prior to entering the Church on the day of the Mass all those attending will be required to undergo a temperature check. Names will then be checked off on the list by the second volunteer upon entry into the Church. Please remember to wear your face mask. Attendees at Mass are required to use hand sanitizer twice: on entering the Church and before Communion. Hand sanitizer will also be available for when you leave the Church should you wish to use it. Communion will be given by the Celebrant only and can only be received on the hand at this time.

Also, volunteers will accompany you to your seats. Seating will be arranged in such a way to facilitate the flow of movement when entering and leaving the Church. Allowances will be made to for family groups or those living in the same household to sit together.

At the conclusion of Mass all those attending will be asked by the Celebrant to leave

immediately to allow the necessary cleaning of the Church to take place. To adhere to the rules of social distancing, directions of how to leave will be given at that time. Please follow all directions from either the Celebrant or the assigned parish volunteers for that day.

#### Fr Alan's Reflection

#### **CONVERSION**

As I mentioned last week I, along with some members of the Parish Community, have been undergoing training in how to facilitate sessions in the Alpha Programme. The sessions are of 75 minutes duration (via zoom). The sessions consist of an ice breaker, prayer, video and discussion. The videos tell stories of people who have experienced conversion in their lives.

This Sunday's Gospel is all about conversion. We are urged to prepare a way for the Lord and to make his paths straight. It is a call to follow Christ in a radical way in all circumstances. We are called to repent, to see our lives differently.

In the First Reading the prophet Isaiah speaks to his people at a time when their experience in exile resulting from the Babylonian captivity was about to end. At the beginning of Mark's Gospel this Sunday these words from Isaiah are taken but applied in a different context. In this case God will come to rescue them not from a physical exile but rather a spiritual one caused by sin.

When hearing the stories of other people's conversion experiences, it can be hard to relate to particularly if it is something, we have not experienced ourselves. Also, people can experience it differently. For some people it can happen by a single event. For other people the experience can be gradual. When I first read biographies about the life of St Vincent de Paul, I thought that his conversion experience was a once off encounter. However, after reading more recent biographies on his life I am now convinced that his conversion was gradual through encountering the poor people of his time.

Whether we have yet to experience conversion or can relate to it either as a once-off encounter or gradual experience, the Gospel calls us to be open to the possibility that it can occur in our lives. Recognizing that all things happen in God's time, I believe there are a few things we can do to help ourselves. Firstly, the Christmas Carol "Joy to the World" contains the following words, 'let every heart prepare him room.' Do we create a space for God in our lives? Do we spend time with God in prayer? Read scripture? Commit to attending Mass now it is possible again? Secondly, preparing the way for the Lord is not so much about what we are prepared to give up but rather what we are prepared to take on. Is there a commitment I can take on that would benefit someone or that would assist my community? Thirdly, right at the beginning this week's Gospel speaks about the Good News of Jesus Christ. Are we good news for other people? Do we live hope filled lives amidst daily struggles? Fourthly, St Paul

speaks about living lives without spot or stain whilst waiting for the second coming of Christ. One way of applying these words is spending a few moments in silence at the end of our day going back over the course of that day. Who did I encounter? Did I respond well to them or not? If I experienced a setback in my day, did I respond gracefully or not?

Alpha invites all who participate to experience the love that God has for them. 'A voice cries out in the wilderness: Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight, make his paths straight.' We are called to encounter the Lord in a realistic way. Conversion is about having hope that the Lord will change our lives for the better. Let every heart prepare him room.

#### **Vinnies launches 2020 Christmas Appeal**

'Belts have tightened around the nation, and our committed volunteers have been prevented from helping because of COVID risks. During lockdown, many Vinnies shops across Australia had to close or reduce their operations, reducing our ability to generate funds to distribute to people in need.

'This year's campaign has been launched at the end of a year many would rather forget.


'But with your help, we will be able to make this festive season that little bit brighter for people in our community who are doing it particularly tough,' Ms Victory said.






What are three things you can do to be ready for Jesus during this second week of Advent?
