FIRST READING:

A reading from the second book of Samuel

The kingdom of David will be established for ever in the sight of the Lord.

Once David had settled into his house and the Lord had given him rest from all the enemies surrounding him, the king said to the prophet Nathan, 'Look, I am living in a house of cedar while the ark of God dwells in a tent'. Nathan said to the king, 'Go and do all that is in your mind, for the Lord is with you.'

But that very night the word of the Lord came to Nathan:

'Go and tell my servant David, "Thus the Lord speaks: Are you the man to build me a house to dwell in? I took you from the pasture, from following the sheep, to be leader of my people Israel; I have been with you on all your expeditions; I have cut off all your enemies before you. I will give you fame as great as the fame of the greatest on earth. GOSPEL:

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke You will conceive and bear a son.

The angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the House of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. He went in and said to her, 'Rejoice, so highly favoured! The Lord is with you.' She was deeply disturbed by these words and asked herself what this greeting could mean, but the angel said to her, 'Mary, do not be afraid; you have won God's favour. Listen! You are to conceive and bear a son, and you must name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his ancestor David; he will rule over the House of Jacob for ever and his reign will have no end.' Mary said to the angel, 'But how can this come about, since I am a virgin?' 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you' the angel answered 'and the power of the Most High will cover you with its shadow. And so the child will be holy and will be called Son of God. Know this too: your kinswoman Elizabeth has, in her old age, herself conceived a son, and she whom people called barren is now in her sixth month, for nothing is impossible to God.' TAP MACHINE


The Parish Tap Machine has been reactivated and now available to use.

CHRISTMAS MASSES

There will be 4 Masses for Christmas – 6.00pm (Christmas Eve), 10.00pm (Christmas Eve), 8.00am (Christmas Day) and 10.00am

Christmas Day. Bookings are now taking place through the trybooking link: https://www.trybooking.com/BNNCA and will conclude on Thursday 24th December (Christmas Eve) at 9.00am. In addition, bookings will also be available for the two Masses on the following weekend 26/27 December for any parishioners who are not able to book in for one of the Christmas Masses. *Bookings will be limited to one time only to allow as many parishioners as possible to attend Mass during this period.* One of the Christmas Masses will be pre-recorded and uploaded to the parish website. *Bookings are essential.* All those attending our Masses are asked to be there half an hour before the start of each Mass to assist the process of checking registration (both ticking of names and using the QR Code) prior to entry into the Church. Doors will need to be closed by the time Mass commences.

Masses on the weekends of 2/3 January and 9/10 January 2021 (Pre-recording only)

It has been through the generosity of our volunteers that our Church has been able to reopen and offer public Masses on the weekends since early November. The current practice of registering for masses for the purposes of contact tracing will be with us for the foreseeable future. Therefore, to give our volunteers a break *there will be no public Mass offered on the weekends of 2/3 January and 9/10 January 2021.* Masses for those weekends will be pre-recorded and uploaded to our parish website.

Fr Alan's Reflection

SAYING YES

Last Wednesday morning I received a message conveying the very sad news that Fr. Maurice Sullivan CM had died. I had known Fr. Maurice for the past 50 years. The first time was back in 1970 when Fr. Maurice was chaplain to my school at Marist Brothers Eastwood. Although not on the parish staff he would also celebrate mass regularly at my home parish at St Anthony's, Marsfield. He visited our home on a couple of occasions. We had a table tennis table under our house back then and Fr. Maurice was ready to accept my challenge to a game of table tennis. A few years later in 1976-1977 Fr. Maurice was Parish Priest of St Anthony's Marsfield. At the end of 1978 I joined a youth group in the Parish known as the Natovi Club which raised money to support our Vincentian Parish at Natovi, Fiji. Fr. Maurice was responsible for starting the Natovi Club. Although he was no longer chaplain when I joined, I would still see him occasionally. It was clear that he had formed a close bond with several members from the Natovi Club. Most of them will be present at his funeral on Friday 18th December.

In 1983 Fr. Maurice asked me if I had ever considered a vocation to the priesthood? It was at a time in my life when I was trying to take my faith more seriously and wondered what saying yes to God would mean for me in the future. I believe that without his question I would not be here at St Joseph's Malvern today as Parish Priest. Fr. Maurice was also my first Director when I began studies for the priesthood in the seminary at St Francis Xavier Seminary in Adelaide, S.A.


As I prepare to go to his funeral, I have reflected on his life these past few days. Fr. Maurice's life was definitely one of saying yes to God. This was carried out through a variety of ministries in being parish priest of parishes in Sydney, Melbourne and Perth, being Director of Spiritual Formation in Adelaide, Chaplain of Marist College Eastwood (twice) and being Provincial of the Vincentian Fathers and Brothers from 1997-2002. It was always a free yes. I, like many others have been touched by his warmth and generosity over the years.

In this Sunday's Gospel Mary is asked to be the Mother of God. It tells us that she was disturbed by the words of the angel Gabriel. She was also searching for what did saying yes to God mean? How would it influence her future? How could she be the mother of God when she was a virgin? Yet despite all of this she placed herself in God's hands. Her words 'let it be done according to your word' captures the spirit of Advent.

Our time of preparation for the coming of Christ is fulfilled when we say yes to God and surrender

our will to his. Mary's yes was not just for that time only but was reaffirmed again and again by the way she lived her life. A generous yes not only fulfils the life of the person who responds in this way but also has a positive influence on those around them.

Fr. Maurice was Parish Priest here at Malvern from 1992-1995. Although I was not here then I heard from one of my confreres and friend, Fr. Les Troy CM, that Fr. Maurice had a great gift for being able to call others forth into ministry. I am sure that today I speak on behalf of many in expressing gratitude to Fr. Maurice for saying yes to God. His yes resulted in living a life that influenced the lives of many people for the better.






