

#### FIRST READING:

A reading from the book of Deuteronomy

I will put my words into the prophet's mouth, and he will tell them all I command.

Moses said to the people: 'Your God will raise up for you a prophet like myself, from among yourselves, from your own brothers; to him you must listen. This is what you yourselves asked of the Lord your God at Horeb on the day of the Assembly. The married woman, on the other hand, has to worry about the world's affairs and devote herself to pleasing her husband. I say this only to help you, not to put a halter round your necks, but simply to make sure that everything is as it should be, and that you give your undivided attention to the Lord.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark This is a new kind of teaching that speaks with authority.


Jesus and his followers went as far as Capernaum, and as soon as the Sabbath came Jesus went to the synagogue and began to teach. And his teaching made a deep impression on them because, unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority.

In their synagogue just then there was a man possessed by an unclean spirit, and it shouted, 'What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are: the Holy One of God.' But Jesus said sharply, 'Be quiet! Come out of him!' And the unclean spirit threw the man into convulsions and with a loud cry went out of him. The people were so astonished that they started asking each other what it all meant. 'Here is a teaching that is new' they said 'and with authority behind it: he gives orders even to unclean spirits and they obey him.' And his reputation rapidly spread everywhere, through all the surrounding Galilean countryside.



## Fr Alan's Reflection

#### LIVING OUT OUR CHRISTIAN VOCATION

Our Second reading for this Sunday tells us that we are called to give our undivided attention to the Lord. In the First Reading Moses tells the people that a prophet will be raised up amongst them. This prophecy was fulfilled in the person and work of Jesus Christ. However, there is another layer to this First reading. I believe it also tells us that we are all called to live out a prophetic vocation. This comes from our baptism where we are proclaimed to be priest, prophet, and king. This is what our Lord wants us to give our undivided attention to; answering his call and seeking to live out that call everyday drawing on his grace and wisdom in the process. How well we live out our prophetic vocation will depend on how well we listen.

I see there are four steps we can take to live out our Christian vocation well.

Firstly, to be positive. Sometimes we can fail to respond to the Lord's call because we do not believe that he could possibly be calling us to do something for him. We can focus on our perceived shortcomings and inadequacies. When he calls us, God asks us to direct our attention to what he has gifted us with. That way our attention is directed to see what is possible rather than looking for excuses not to respond.

Secondly, to be protected. In the Gospel it tells us that Jesus spoke with authority. This authority did not depend on the volume of his voice or how polished his presentation may have been. It depended on drawing on the power that comes from God. If we seek to protect ourselves by drawing on God's power in our lives it helps us to respond to God's call with purpose. Failing to do that results in us trying to move forward recklessly and it is not possible to succeed in that way.

Thirdly, we must listen to what the Word of God is saying to us each week with undivided attention. A simple test is to ask ourselves each week after Mass has concluded, how much of the readings can I recall? How many times would we have to say, 'I don't remember' because our attention was divided, and our minds were somewhere else? When our attention is divided, we too are commanded by Jesus to be still and to be silent. He tells us that we are his and he has everything to give us.

Fourthly, to rid ourselves with what is unclean in our lives. What are we listening to? What are we watching? What are we filling our hearts with? Are we pure?

Jesus stands before us as the mirror image of who we can become. He calls us into our true self, as people who are made in the image and likeness of God. If we listen to that voice, we will be astounded of what can become of our lives.

Monday 1<sup>st</sup> February 2021 Readings: Hebrews 11:32-40;

Mark 5:1-20 CLEANLINESS



Create a clean heart within me. Put a steadfast spirit within me. Do not cast me away from your presence nor deprive me of your Holy Spirit (Psalm 51). I was thinking of these words as I was reflecting on the Gospel about unclean spirits. Sometimes when we think of spiritual uncleanliness the first thing we may think about is sexual sin. It can be that, but a pure heart is also how we relate to people generally. Do we want what is best for others or do we think about how they can best serve our own interests? What do we feed ourselves with what we read, watch and listen to? Let us also recognize Christ as the Holy One of God and live our life according to his will.

**Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> February 2021 The Presentation of the Lord Readings: Malachi 3:1-4; Luke 2:22-40** 

PROMPTED BY THE SPIRIT?

Today's Gospel tells us that prompted by the Spirit Simeon went to the Temple. He believed that he would not see death until he had encountered the Christ. This movement showed that he was in tune with the Holy Spirit in his life. What is the Holy Spirit moving us toward? What does the Holy Spirit want to reveal to us? What are we called to do before our life is over? Whatever it is, let us not delay in presenting it to the Lord.



Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2021 Readings: 12:4-7,11-15; Mark 6:1-6 FAITH

Today's Gospel tells us that Jesus was amazed at the lack of faith shown by his own people and as a result could work no miracle there. We too can prevent God's power from working in our lives when we start to think things are impossible because of circumstances or particular people that we must deal with. Let us keep looking towards Jesus who visits us every day and accept his word. Just because what we might be facing presents plenty of challenges does not mean it is impossible. The First Reading reminds us that God always has our best interests at heart and will help us. All it requires is a little faith on our part.

When I reflect on today's Gospel the word that comes to me is detachment. Jesus was instructing his disciples to take only what was necessary for the journey. The disciples were told to shake the dust off their sandals whenever they met a dead end. What is it that I need to move on from to free myself so that I become more available to the call that God is placing on my life?



She became a Catholic and eventually a Canossian Sister and was canonised in 2000.

To mark this year's International Day ACRATH is part of a special seven-hour **Marathon of Prayer** moving around the globe and including a prayer and address from Pope Francis. In fact a group of ACRATH members and a participant from New Zealand, will kick off the event in the first hour.









Draw Jesus healing Simon's sick mother-in-law
