RECONCILIATION

Saturdays 9.45am & 5.30pm

This is the last Sunday of Advent before Christmas. In Luke's gospel this weekend, we hear the baby John the Baptist leap in the womb of Elizabeth and her expression of joy and praise to God when Mary, carrying Jesus in her womb, visits her. Christmas is the season of joy and praise. We express our joy and praise to God through Christmas carols exalting the birth of our Saviour. combination of two Greek words khoros (χορός) and aulos (αὐλός) is 'khoraules (χοραυλες) which means 'reed or wind instrument accompanying a choral dance' is 'choraules' in Latin. 'khoraules (χοραυλες) in Greek, which in Latin is 'choraules / choraula' means flute player or reed pipe player. Carol could have originated from this Latin word *choraula*. The meaning of carol is a circle dance accompanied by singing (round dance singing); to praise or celebrate in song; to sing; specially to sing joyfully; a song of praise, joy, exultation, or mirth. A Christmas carol is a devotional song of praise, joy, exultation, and mirth, which relates the birth of Christ, the events surrounding that glorious birth and tells all about Christmas. May we join the heavenly hosts this Christmas joyfully praising the birth of Christ.
