### Do whatever he tells you

This weekend's gospel from John gives us the account of the wedding at Cana where Jesus turns water into wine at the request of his mother, Mary (John 2:1-11). The first of the Gospels to be written was Mark's. In Mark, we find a voice from heaven proclaiming Jesus as the Son of God at his baptism. Matthew and Luke both speak of the virginal conception by the Holy Spirit, which reveal Jesus as the Son of God. The Gospel of John, which was the last of the Gospels to be written, proclaims the 'preexistence' of Jesus, the Word of God, with the Father, marking the highest development of Christology. Here we find doctrinal development on the understanding of Jesus Christ in the early Christian community. As the doctrinal development of Jesus unfolded so did the mention of Mary his mother. Mark makes no mention of the birth and infancy of Jesus but Matthew and Luke mention the virginal conception of Mary and the birth of Jesus. In John's Gospel, Mary appears in the beginning as intercessor and the end of Jesus' ministry as 'mother' of the faithful.

The key to understanding Mary is this; we do not start with Mary. We start with Christ, the Son of the Living God. For there is one God, and there is one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus (I Tim 2:5). Jesus is the mediator of a better and new covenant (Hebrews 7:22; 8:6; 9:15). The mediation of Christ is unique and nothing can compare to it. Christ's mediation is not just intercession. It is of salvation and redemption through his blood in the new and everlasting covenant. Thus in this aspect there is no other mediator but Jesus Christ. It is on account of Our Lord Jesus Christ that Mary receives special attention, and not on account of herself. Our Lord is God Who became Man. We did not choose Mary, He did. At Cana though he said 'My hour is not yet come' (John 2:4), yet he chose to listen to Mary. Let us seek her intercession and listen to Mary's advice, "Do whatever he tells you" (John 2:5).
