# Prayer and Witness.

In this weekend's gospel the Pharisees test Jesus with the question on divorce and the Law of Moses (Mark 10:2-12) because in the Book of Deuteronomy 24:1-4 there are prescribed grounds for divorce according to Mosaic Law. The grounds for divorce is 'unchastity' (Matthew 5:32;19:9). Jesus' answer to the prohibition of divorce is taken from the Book of Genesis which is the first reading this weekend. The plan of God from creation is the unity man and woman in marriage, which 'no one must put asunder'. From this, we understand that divorce did exist among the early Jews, Christians and wider society and does so even today.

In Matthews Gospel we read that 'Mary was betrothed to Joseph and when he found her to be with child he being a just man wanted to divorce her quietly' (Matthew 1:18-20). It is easy to read and continue perusing these passages. But contemplating this passage could reveal the tension that could have taken place between Mary and Joseph. Mary was with child before marriage to Joseph and according to Mosaic Law she was 'unchaste'. So, Joseph could divorce her. The thoughts of divorce that Joseph went through and its effects on Mary is something the unborn Jesus faced while still in the womb of his mother. Scripture testifies that baby John the Baptist leapt in pregnant Elizabeth's womb on hearing the voice of Mary the mother of Jesus who was also pregnant with Jesus. So also, while Jesus was in the womb of his mother Mary, did experience the effects of the misunderstandings that went on between his foster father Joseph and Mary. In this modern age, divorce is a reality. Children are the most affected in these cases. There was misunderstanding and lack of communication in the case of Joseph and Mary. But by the grace and intervention of God there was no break-up. In our present context. too we have families, which misunderstandings and break ups.

There could be innumerable causes for these break ups that we may not understand. So we need to be careful in judging families who are in such situations. Delores Kuenning, a Christian author, sums this up beautifully in the preface of her book 'Helping People Through Grief', "But human suffering is not confined to death grief. Pain also comes with the birth of babies with handicaps, with abortions, with divorce, with missing children, and with debilitating illness and injuries." Delores Kuenning quotes Kenneth A. Erickson, "Some assert that the loss in divorce is worse that the loss of death. After death, one recalls good things about the person. After a loss through divorce, one tends to remember unhappy, hostile experiences. Divorce is a death that is never complete; it tends to recur with each family contact after which the relationship dies all over again." The effects of divorce could be traumatic for some.

In our own time the increase in divorce, the legalization of same sex marriage, abortion and contraception has changed the moral fabric of society. There is a fear of regress in family values and marital fidelity in a society, which has achieved materialistic progress. It is in this background that we hear from Jesus about 'the union of marriage between a man and woman'. We are called to engage with our society that we live in with this message from Jesus on marital fidelity. The way to engage is to bear witness to the lived experience of marital fidelity. Before engaging, we need to withdraw; that is to be people of prayer. Hence, we are called to be people of prayer and witness.
