The need to feel recognised, wanted and important is there in all of us to some degree and there is nothing wrong with that. What matters is how we go about achieving that. This could be done in a constructive way or in a destructive manner. The constructive way would be, for us Christians, to live a life following Jesus by loving and respecting God and one another; being Jesus to others and seeing Him in others. The destructive way would be opposite to that, just thinking of only our needs and desires and not acknowledging the needs of other.

This weekend's Gospel speaks about two of the twelve apostles, James and John, seeking a prominent position in the Kingdom of God by asking Jesus to let them sit one on his right and the other on the left. They had a very good and holy desire in requesting this. In fact, we all need to have this desire to be close to Jesus. But the problem, as Jesus points out to them, is that greatness in the Kingdom of God doesn't depend on social standing, position or authority. In the Kingdom of God 'anyone who wants to become great must be your servant, and anyone who wants to be first must be slave to all.' (Mark 10:43-44) This sign of service we find when Jesus washes the feet of his apostles at the Last Supper (John 13:1-17). Just as Jesus came to serve, we too are called to serve God in those around us.
