

To give until it hurts

St Cyril of Jerusalem was made Bishop of Jerusalem around 350 AD. He left important writings, documenting the instruction of catechumens (those preparing for baptism). In one of his writings, he speaks about the twofold meaning of 'faith'. The first one is concerned with doctrine the second is what our Lord refers to as 'faith as a grain of mustard seed'. This weekend's gospel speaks about the scribes, who had knowledge of 'doctrine', and the poor widow whose faith was simple and small as the mustard seed. St Pauls writing to the Corinthians says, "'Knowledge' puffs up, but love builds up" (I Corinthians 8:1). He continues in the same letter, "And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge and if I have all faith, so as to move mountains, but have no love I am nothing." (13:2). It is good to have knowledge about our faith but it is necessary that our actions are centred on love of God and one another. This weekend's gospel is not just about being generous with money but with ourselves as well. Love gives totally and completely, like the widow who "out of her poverty has put everything she had, her whole living." (Mark 12:44) It would have certainly have hurt the widow to give 'her whole living'. In the words of St Mother Teresa: "This is the true meaning of love, to give until it hurts". To give ourselves just as Christ gives himself in the Eucharist. > Fr George
