A MESSAGE FROM FR. MICHAEL

Welcome back to The Tidings! We apologise for the sudden break in transmission as we endeavoured to keep afloat with the many changes we have been experiencing at this time. So much has happened in the past 3 weeks, I am not sure where to start...Perhaps it would be a good time to update you all on the changes to the current COVID-19 restrictions and how these changes affects our community.

As of **22 June 2020**, the following directives have been given by the Victorian State Government and the Archdiocese of Melbourne for places of worship -

- Only 20 people will be able to be present at any one time for private devotion. Social distancing will be observed. *The Melton Parish weekly private devotion session is held at St Catherine of Siena Church on Sunday between 10am* - 12pm. Contact details are taken as per the Melbourne Archdiocese directive.
- Sanitisation will be available at the Church and regular cleaning will also be performed.
- All other ceremonies are by arrangement only. Numbers are capped as per Government guidelines.

We have decided to continue with online Masses, at least for the foreseeable future. This has given our community an opportunity to spend time with God in a meaningful way. It is said that the Eucharist is the source and summit of Christian life and by setting aside this sacred time, it has given so many an opportunity to share this important part of Christian life in the privacy and safety of their own home.

We are accepting Baptisms once more. If you or a friend /family member would like to book in a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office during business hours. With the restrictions, we are extending the times and also the days for Baptisms. Baptism will be available in July on both Saturday and Sunday. We will be publishing a full revised timetable for 2020 on Tuesday 30 June—so keep an eye on the new revamped website!


Enrolment dates extended

A reading from the second book of the Kings

One day as Elisha was on his way to Shunem, a woman of rank who lived there pressed him to stay and eat there. After this he always broke his journey for a meal when he passed that way. She said to her husband, 'Look, I am sure the man who is constantly passing our way must be a holy man of God. Let us build him a small room on the roof, and put him a bed in it, and a table and chair and lamp; whenever he comes to us he can rest there.'

One day when he came, he retired to the upper room and lay down. 'What can be done for her?' he asked. Gehazi (his servant) answered, 'Well, she has no son and her husband is old.' Elisha said, 'Call her.' The servant called her and she stood at the door. 'This time next year,' Elisha said 'you will hold a son in your arms.'

Second reading

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans

When we were baptised in Christ Jesus we were baptised in his death; in other words, when we were baptised we went into the tomb with him and joined him in death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the Father's glory, we too might live a new life.

But we believe that having died with Christ we shall return to life with him: Christ, as we know, having been raised from the dead will never die again. Death has no power over him any more. When he died, he died, once for all, to sin, so his life now is life with God; and in that way, you too must consider yourselves to be dead to sin but alive for God in Christ Jesus.

<u>Gospel</u>

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Jesus instructed the Twelve as follows: 'Anyone who prefers father or mother to me is not worthy of me. Anyone who prefers son or daughter to me is not worthy of me. Anyone who does not take his cross and follow in my footsteps is not worthy of me. Anyone who finds his life will lose it; anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it.

'Anyone who welcomes you welcomes me; and those who welcome me welcome the one who sent me.

'Anyone who welcomes a prophet because he is a prophet will have a prophet's reward; and anyone who welcomes a holy man because he is a holy man will have a holy man's reward.

'If anyone gives so much as a cup of cold water to one of these little ones because he is a disciple, then I tell you solemnly, he will most certainly not lose his reward.'
