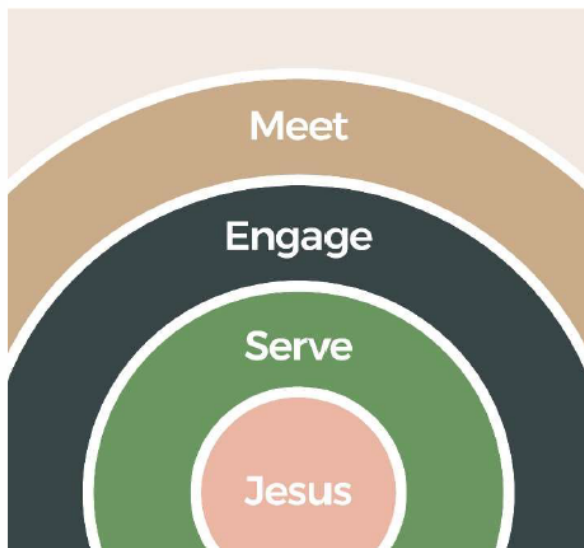

FATHER MICHAEL'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends

We are familiar with the term "Catholic Mission" and with the annual appeal this week to support the Church's missionary presence all over the world. It has a long history, beginning with Jesus' himself who was sent by God for the world's salvation.

Each Easter season, the book of the Acts of the Apostles proclaimed at Mass puts us in vital contact with the intense missionary spread of the gospel in the apostolic age.

The great missionaries of Europe are household names, such as Patrick and Boniface in western Europe and Cyril and Methodius in eastern Europe.

Mission stood in the forefront of people's awareness in the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries. With the discovery of the 'new world' of the Americas, preachers accompanied

virtually every voyage of discovery. In company with the European conquerors, both in the Americas and in Asia, missionaries brought the gospel. The ambivalence of this conjunction has left a difficult legacy of suffering.

Finally, in this century, the gift of a missionary presence is exercised in a new way.

The theological understanding of missionary effort has developed. Rapid communications and the growing intermingling of populations each with their unique culture was a topic that the Second Vatican Council considered carefully.

The fruit of the Council's discussions was a clear understanding that the Holy Spirit speaks to the conscience of every single human being. Missionary preaching is not the first revelation of God to a non-believer or to an adherent of another religion. However, the 'anonymous' way in which God has been

communicating with a person in their conscience becomes explicit through the presence of a missionary.

The work of Sister Stan Mumuni (illustration on page three today) is a good example of the new style of mission. She is a Christian thanks to missionaries' preaching in the past. Now, she is herself a missionary within her own culture. The first missionary effort results in the children being able to survive physically. The cultural conviction that these 'spirit children' are to be feared or rejected needs another missionary effort to bring respect and justice to them.

With the rapid urbanisation of the world, the peripheries of the huge conurbations are a new 'field white for the harvest' requiring a fresh missionary inspiration and method. Pope Francis seeks to raise awareness of this change and of what it requires of us, the body of Christ. He asks me to think of myself as 'a missionary disciple' right where I find myself on any day.
