FATHER MICHAEL'S MESSAGE

One month to a bitter social change

One month from today, 19th June, voluntary assisted dying will become legal in Victoria. We must recognize that this euphemism (VAD) attempts to mask that killing will be legal, that society will undergo radical change for the worse, that we need to learn from other's mistakes, and that it makes a mockery of our attempts at suicide prevention.

KILLING

"Some advocates of voluntary assisted dying want to avoid terms like physician-assisted suicide because, they argue, such terms already imply moral judgements. These advocates seem implicitly to think that suicide is morally wrong.

Instead, and I am being careful to use morally neutral language here, they want killing yourself, or asking others to kill you, in certain circumstances, to be considered desirable and morally acceptable, unlike killing yourself in all other circumstances." (Bishop Tim Harris, Townsville)

The bishops of Queensland have said some people might argue against using the word "kill" because it was morally charged. "We disagree: 'murder' is morally charged; 'kill' is not. Killing is a clear descriptive verb."

"Voluntary assisted dying is the euphemistic phrase attached to the direct killing of a human for alleged humanitarian purposes. A community that kills the vulnerable, elderly, the sick, is not a progressive community, but a community of death." (Dr Timothy Coyle - 48 years' experience)

CHANGE TO SOCIETY

"Assisted suicide and euthanasia enshrine in law a rejection of the duties we owe to others and of the claims others have upon us. It poses a threat to the social, legal, and cultural norms underlying civil society in Australia." (Peter Kurti, Senior Research Fellow, Centre for Independent Studies, Sydney, from his latest book, Euthanasia – Putting the Culture to Death)

"The sick, the elderly, the disabled, the chronically ill and the dying must never be made to feel they are a burden." (Dr Michael Gannon, former AMA president)

"Given the psychological vulnerability of the average old person, the sense they already have of being 'unproductive burdens' and the power of insensitive family or medical staff to reinforce this sense, such a decision will be made from a position of humiliation and weakness." (Dr David van Gend, Brisbane GP)

Voluntary assisted dying "creates a culture which chooses to make people dead rather than care for them in dying."
(D van Gend)

"Death is a natural part of life and if the person is receiving good palliative care there really is no need for euthanasia." (T Coyle)

"The deeper question in (VAD) is how should we as individuals and as a society respond to the vulnerabilities inherent in aging and dying, inherent, in other words, in being human." (Catholic Bishops of Queensland, 2019)

"Assisted suicide and euthanasia enshrines in law a rejection of the duties we owe to others and of the claims others have on us. It poses a threat to the social, legal, and cultural norms underlying civil society in Australia." (P Kurti)

"Once termination of life is authorised the threshold is crossed. It is now much easier to liberalise the conditions governing the law. And liberalised they will be." (Paul Keating, former Prime Minister)

OTHERS' MISTAKES

"In 2017, suicide was the leading cause of death in Australia among people aged between 15-44 years, and the second leading cause of death among those 45-54 years of age." (Aust. Bureau of Statistics)

"If we are rightly concerned about high rates of suicide, then surely we should also be concerned about claims that some circumstances make suicide legitimate? If we are consistent, our first concern is to

work out what we can do to help a person live whatever life they have in a meaningful way." (D van Gend)

"Supply has created demand. A culture of euthanasia undermines our capacity to deal with suffering, and that is very bad for society." (Theo Boer, Dutch bioethicist, who initially supported euthanasia, 2018)

According to Victoria's new assisted suicide laws, in order for a patient to access the assisted suicide regime, two doctors must agree that their terminal illness would otherwise kill them within 12 months.

When 54 year-old Victorian Troy

Thornton could not find two doctors to do so, he flew to Switzerland and took his life. In the last hours of his life, Thornton explained why the Victorian laws had to "evolve" to include people like him – that "the focus on being terminal is wrong. It's about the right to choose how you die, no matter how old you are, no matter what sickness, or non-sickness you've got."

"A danger with concentrating only on the possible consequences is that we may tacitly accept the idea that encouraging or assisting suicide for seriously ill people would be a good thing if only it could be controlled. What is missing is the deeper question of the meaning of inherent human dignity, especially in relation to disability or various forms of practical dependence, and the human solidarity that is expressed or undermined by our actions." (David Albert Jones professor at St Mary's University, Twickenham, UK)

In the Netherlands, there was an 8% increase in demands for assisted suicide in 2017. In Quebec last year, in the first year of operation of a VAD law, the estimate of 100 deaths was surpassed fourfold – 400 deaths.
